Astonishing Love Eager acceptance from the God who runs

Wonderful to contemplate. Impossible to fathom. There is, in the most familiar and beloved story told by Jesus Christ, a striking image of the amazing love of God for man. In three parables recorded in Luke 15, the Master Teacher emphasizes his Heavenly Father's concern for sinners. This concern is portrayed in the first parable when the shepherd who left the flock to find one wayward sheep returns, exclaiming, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost!" (15:6). In the second, the woman who finds the lost coin likewise calls for her friends to join in her rejoicing, with Jesus making the point: "Likewise...there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents" (15:10).

But it is in the third—the famed parable of the prodigal son—that this joy finds expression in a most poignant and unforgettable fashion. The son, having requested his portion of his father's inheritance, journeys to a far country and wastes it all with reckless and sinful self-indulgence.

Eventually he finds himself in desperate need, and determines to return home—not to resume his former status as a privileged son, but only to confess his sin and beg to be a slave in his father's house. As he makes his way home—humbled, ashamed, prepared to acknowledge to his father "I am no longer worthy to be called your son"—we find this astonishing response: "But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him....The father said to his



servants, Bring out the best robe and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his feet. And bring the fatted calf here and kill it, and let us eat and be merry; for this my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found" (15:20-24).

The marvel here is that the father is not only willing to receive his son back, (Continued on page 2)

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but anxious to do so, and that eagerness is seen in the dramatic image of the father running—yes running!—to meet his now haggard but humbled son. Our Heavenly Father not only receives sinners who repent of their prodigal ways and return to him, but he rejoices in bestowing upon them all the blessings of sonship. Not only does he show mercy to sinners, but he delights in doing so: "He does not retain his anger forever, Because he delights in mercy. He will have compassion on us" (Mic. 7:18-19).

How our Holy and Just God would rejoice in receiving me, a lowly sinner who has rebelled against him and dishonored his Holy Name, is beyond my ability to comprehend. That he would give his Son to make my return possible and grant me an honored place in his household, is more than I can grasp. Why, after all I have done, would he run to meet me, array me in glorious apparel, and celebrate my return? Thankfully, I do not have to understand how he could love me so. I will simply rejoice in knowing that he does.

Dear friend, if you have not obeyed the gospel of Christ, or if you have ceased walking in the light of God's word, you are estranged from him and recklessly continuing in a course that will only lead to despair and, ultimately, eternal hell. The good news is that heaven awaits your repentance and will rejoice at your return. Let us help you come home to the Father. He will do more than make you his own. He will run to meet you.

To See Is To Love To Love Is To Follow By Bill Burk

The prayers of others can bless the soul of the devoted follower of Jesus. What diligent Bible student hasn't thrilled at the sentiments found in the Psalms? It's practically impossible for the spiritually in tune not to marvel at the prayer of Jesus (John 17), the early church (Acts 4:24-31) and those of Paul (Eph. 1:15-23; 3:14-21; Phi. 1:9-11; Col. 1:9-12). Even contemporary prayers can be a blessing. Richard of Chichester, who lived during the thirteenth century, penned these devotional thoughts.

Dearest Lord Jesus, Savior and Friend, Three things I pray: To See thee more clearly, To Love thee more dearly, To Follow thee more nearly, Day by Day. Amen.

Although there may be some disagreement regarding the addressing of the Lord Jesus (cf. Mat. 6:9ff), the tenor of the thoughts should cause a longing in the heart. In fact, there's a natural progression to be found. If we see Jesus clearly, we will love Him even more so, and loving Him more will motivate us to follow Him that much closer. Let's break individual parts down by noting the need to...

- 1. See Jesus More Clearly. The Hebrews writer wrote, "But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone" (Heb. 2:9). The disciple of Christ should strive to see Jesus in His humanity (Heb. 2:14; 4: 14-15); in His majestic rule and reign (1 Tim. 6: 17; Rev. 19: 16); regarding His substitutionary death (1 Pet. 3:17) and the grace He provides (Titus 2:11-14). We like the Greeks should say, "Sirs, we wish to see Jesus" (John 12:21).
- 2. **To Love Him More Dearly**. If! keep my eyes focused on Jesus (Heb. 12:2); if! see Him as He is;
