Sadly, though, many people go through this world of trouble with no hope and no peace, but such does not have to be the case!

The Bible is God's revealed Word for the purpose of making one "perfect (complete— RTS), thoroughly furnished unto all good works" (2 Timothy 3:16-17) and we are told that God has given us "all things that pertain to life and godliness" (2 Peter 1:3). Is it not great to know that not only did God love us enough to send His Son to die for us (John 3:16) but He also desired to give us a better life, I believe both here and in eternity (John 10:10)? Therefore peace and hope is not just a side-note of the gospel message, it is a vital part of the gospel message! So as Paul wrote to the Romans and spoke of the salvation that was available to ALL in Jesus Christ, he wrote, "Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost." Wherever the inspired (2 Timothy 3:16 2 Corinthians 2:6-13), soul-saving (Romans 1:16) gospel message of Jesus Christ is proclaimed and followed, it will fill us with hope and peace! The world may not think peace and hope are possible, but we know such can be found—only in Jesus Christ. And Now A Word From Our Creator by Bill Burk

Probably all of us have been watching some television show when suddenly there's a break in the programming and a voice comes over the sound system, "And now a word from one of our sponsors..." A commercial then flashes on the screen with a narrator who says something like, *"Me* you tired of acid reflux? If so then ask your physician about..." It's been estimated that the average American, who lives to be 80 years old, will see some seven million advertisements in his lifetime. Most of the commercials that appear before us we immediately tune out. We've seen so many we're just not interested in seeing anymore. Perhaps we've become the same way regarding the promises of God. We've heard them a lot. However, unlike so many products on the market, we need the truths of God's word. So pay attention, "And Now A Word From Our Creator...

- "Are You Lost? I Will Save You." The sin problem is universal (1 Kings 8:46; Ecc. 7:20; Rom. 3:23). God sent His Son Jesus into the world to save us from our sins (Mat. 1:21; John 1:29; 3:16; Acts 5:31; 10:43; 13:38; etc.). Jesus verified this truth as He explained His mission "For the Son of Man came to seek and save the lost" (Matt. 18:11). Both sinner and saint alike need Him. The sinner needs initial forgiveness of His sins through the blood of Christ (Rev. 1:5; Acts 2:38) and the saint needs His continual cleansing (1 Jn 1:7-9).
- 2. "Are You Tired? I Will Give You Rest." Most people are very much aware of the burden and guilt of sin (Psa. 32:3-4). The world and its system, despite its fleshly promises, leaves us frazzled, stressed, worn out and despondent. But in the midst of it all the Lord still says, "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest..." (Mat. 11 :28-30). He provides rest from the burden of sin through His blood (Eph. 1 :7). He replaces it with peace, serenity, contentment and joy (Rom. 5:1; 1 Tim. 6:6-8; John 14:27).
- **3. "Are You Lonely? I Will Befriend You."** So many people in the world; young and old alike suffer from loneliness. The apostle Paul experienced loneliness yet he stated that in the worst of times the Lord stood with Him and strengthened Him (2 Tim. 4:17). When others leave and forsake us, the Lord remains (Heb. 13:5-6). He is the friend that sticks closer than a brother (pro. 18:24).
- 4. "Are You Worried? I Will Take Care Of You." Recession; unemployment; nuclear weapons; crime; poverty; disease; death. We live in a scary world. At the same time, the Lord Himself commands us not to worry while at the same time promising to take care of our needs (Mat. 6:25-34). The Psalmist said, "I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread" (Psa. 37:25). If the Lord's on our side we have nothing to fear (Rom. 8:28-39).
- **5.** "**Are You Purposeless? I Will Use You.**" The Bible teaches that we have been created for God's glory (Isa. 43 :7). Beautifully, the Lord invites us to labor with Him and participate in His grand scheme of redemption (cf. 2 Cor. 6:1). Each of us have been created in the image of God (Gen. 1:26-27) and meant for the body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:20). In Christ, life has great meaning and purpose (1 Tim. 4:7-9).

This worshipper may have been to the dance or nightclub on Saturday night, and	 Seventh, and last, we list the DEVOTED WORSHIPPER. This type puts his heart into every act of homage paid unto God that is divinely authorized. He recognizes that he is in the august of presence of his Creator, and conducts himself accordingly. He is punctual, and he is ready to do all things prescribed by God. Now if we were to try to analyze all these worshippers and seek the reasons behind actions, we would find one great difference. The first six were all woefully lacking in one area, namely a love for God. The devoted worshipper does what he knows he should because God first loved him, and he loves God and his brethren in return. If love for God is the motivation for our worship to Him, we will have no difficulty finding the time, the necessary effort and the right attitude with which to worship God.
