

Attendance Matters By Kevin W. Rhodes

For whatever reason, attendance is one of those subjects that people do not want to discuss very often when it pertains to their spiritual lives. To some, the preacher mentions it too frequently as it is, instead of getting around to other more important topics. I suppose that some grow frustrated hearing about it and assume that the preacher or the elders are only interested in the number on the board at the front of the auditorium, but that would be inaccurate and quite unfair. That number represents individual souls who are troubled, tired, hurting, growing, searching, weak, maturing, apathetic, and even hypocritical. It includes elders, deacons, preachers; teachers, workers, new converts, visitors; singles, couples, babies, families, widows; people brought up in the church, people who were converted; people with money, people with nothing; young, old, and in between (Gal. 3:26-29). The nature and mission of the church make this not only inevitable but also proper. All of these people have different strengths, different weaknesses, and different backgrounds, but the Lord calls on them all to gather together for their mutual benefit.

The current climate in society spurns the Lord's design, expecting the church to cater to people and provide specialty groups where people can find a guarantee of others with similar interests. "Designer" churches are cropping up everywhere to try to fill a niche in "the market." Community churches, cowboy churches, biker churches, and political churches, to name a few, now spot the landscape, intermingling with traditional denominations to produce an even more confusing pattern of religiosity. Even some in the church have fallen prey to this thinking. But the beauty of studying the Bible, seeking to improve our lives before God, and bowing down before our Lord is sometimes lost on people due to their simplicity. Some grow weary of attending regularly because it seems like "too much" for them, while remaining completely oblivious to the fact that it is the world that is wearing them out-not the Lord or His people! Other find the "sameness" boring, apparently unaware that the "sameness" is in their hearts rather than in worship and Bible study. Many people are simply takers: they want to take from the Lord and take from the church without ever giving anything of themselves (2 Cor. 8:5).

Your attendance matters. It matters to those who watch for your souls and set up opportunities for us to assemble together (Heb. 13: 17). It matters to the Bible Class teachers who spend hours preparing material for you and your children (Jas. 3: 17). It matters to the preacher who has spent the week preparing something from God's Word for your spiritual benefit (2 Tim. 4:2-4). It matters to the guest speakers who are receiving an impression of what you are as a Christian. Most of all, it matters to the God, who calls on us to assemble (Heb. 10:25), and to the Lord, whom we are to remember every Lord's day (1 Cor. 11 :23-29). So, does your attendance matter to you? I guess we will see.

Let's Work Our Wings Off By Mike Riley

Beekeepers know that a bee's age is determined by the condition of its wings. Because bees constantly work, their wings get a lot of wear and tear. Young bees have wide well-formed wings, whereas older bees have narrow, tom, and tattered wings.

The bee doesn't die of old age. It dies when its wings are completely worn out and it can no longer work or fly. Near the point of death, the bee points itself away from the beehive and begins



to fly, never to return again. The bee literally wears itself out working!

As we look at the worn out bee, there's a spiritual lesson for us. As Christians, we must be diligent servants, doing the work of the Lord. In Revelation 2-3, when Jesus evaluated the spiritual condition of the seven churches of Asia, He refers to their labor in the Lord's kingdom (Revelation 2:2; Revelation 2:9; Revelation 2:13; Revelation 2:19; Revelation 3:1; Revelation 3:8; Revelation 3:15). Their degree of acceptance was directly proportional to the kind and amount of work they were doing.

The inspired writer James records these words in this regard:

"But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does." (James 1:25)

If we desire to be recipients of the spiritual blessings of this life and the life to come, we must be "a doer of the work." We must be a people who are willing to "work our wings off' in the Lord's service (1 Corinthians 15:58 NKJV; cf. 1 Corinthians 3:5-9; Jeremiah 48:10 AMP).

Have We Become Too Busy? By Wayne Rodgers

It was Ben Franklin who said, "Dost thou love life? Then do not squander time, for that is the stuff life is made of." What is time? Einstein said it is what the clock read. There is solar time, Atomic time, daytime, nighttime, local time, good times, and old times. The Bible says that Felix waited for a "convenient time." Paul said that "now is the accepted time" (2 Cor. 6:2) and that the "time is short" (1 Cor. 7:29). James said "life is but a vapor, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away" (James 4:14). Every birthday is a milestone of the relentless march of time and a reminder that we are quickly passing through the sands of this world. "As for man, his days are as grass: as a flower of the field, so he flourisheth. For the wind passeth over it, and it is gone; and the place thereof shall know it no more. But the mercy of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear him, and his righteousness unto children's children; To such as keep his covenant, and to those that remember his commandments to do them" (Psa. 103:15-18). We have learned that we can never go back, only forward in time.

Time comes from God, though God himself lives outside the boundaries of time. "But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day" (2 Pet. 3:8). Time began when God created the universe-"And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day" (Gen. 1:5). God created the stars in their courses that determine our hours, days, months, and years (Gen. 1:16). As the one who has control over time, God gives it out to us a moment at a time. Someday, we shall stand before God and turn in, as it were, a time card accounting for how we have used his gift (cf. 1 Cor. 4:2; Lk. 16:2). Are we good stewards of the "time" we have been given by God? We should all say with Moses, "So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom" (Psa. 90:12).
