Tracking

Many hunters have acquired the ability to track animals. There are certain signs that they look for and after finding them can tell the direction that they need to go. It does have certain draw backs because the trail may lead one into a place that he really does not need to go like the cave of a mean spirited grizzly! Another gift of technology is that a person can order a product and then track [its] journey to the destination. Radars can track the approach or departure of aircraft or almost anything equipped with GPS. The thing about tracking is that it relies on signs or evidence.

As we consider this discussion, a thought comes to mind, "Am I leaving enough evidence in my life that I can lead folks to Christ? If people followed my path, where would I lead them?" In John 20:30-31, John wrote that Jesus had performed many signs, "but these were written that you might believe." The lessons Jesus taught and the miracles or signs He performed led men to the Father. Our lives leave impressions or influences on those with which we contact. Can our friends and associates track our example to Christ? The Bible tells us that certain Greeks approached Philip saying, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus" (John 12:21). The Christian must live his life with such conviction that when men search for the Christ they will know where to go. How often are folks surprised to learn, because of the way a certain person lives their life, that the person is a member of the church of Christ. Or like Peter does their speech betray them (Matt. 26:73)?

The Christians at Thessalonica were commended by Paul because of their example, (1 Thess. 1:6-9) "And you became followers of us and of the Lord, having received the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Spirit, so that you became examples to all in Macedonia and Achaia who believe. For from you the word of the Lord has sounded forth, not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but also in every place. Your faith toward God has gone out, so that we do not need to say anything. For they themselves declare concerning us what manner of entry we had to you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God." It has been said that imitation is the greatest form of flattery. Do we imitate our Lord like these folks? Does our faith need explanation or can it be seen in our life like the faithful people of old (See Heb. 11). If people are tracking us will we lead them to the Savior or away from Him? We are either examples of righteousness, (Phil. 3:17), or examples of ungodliness, (2 Peter 2:6).

Studies For The Week of April 25th:

Sunday Class......1 Corinthians (Chap. 7)

Who Are God's People? (Titus 2:14)

God's grace teaches us how we are to live (v11-4), specifically were are to be God's people; a people that are:

1) Purchased - "[Christ] gave Himself for us..."

- a) So live as belonging to God (1 Cor. 6:20).
- b) Bought with great cost (1 Pet. 1:18-19) to be reconciled to God (Eph. 2:16) and He did so willingly (John 10:17-18; John 3:16; Eph. 5:2)

2) Pure-"...He might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify..."

- a) A people washed from sin in obedience (Heb. 8:12; 1 Pet. 1:22 -23; Acts 22:16; 1 John 1:7-9).
- b) A people with a desire to stay pure by serving God (Eph. 4:22-24; Rom. 6:12-13, 16-18; Eph. 5:27).

3) Possessed - "...unto himself a peculiar people..."

- a) A people only for God (1 Pet. 2:9-10; Ex. 20:1-6; Matt. 6:24).
- b) That as a result act different from this world (2 Cor. 6:16-18; Phil. 1:27; 1 Pet. 1:15; 1Pet. 2:11; Phil. 3:20).

4) Passionate – "...zealous of good works."

- a) Zealous to do good and bring glory to God (Matt. 5:16); eagerly doing our task (Eph. 2:10) and encouraging others in such (Titus 2:7; Heb. 10:24).
- b) Zeal must come from a knowledge of God's Will (Rom. 10:2) which He has equiped us from (2 Tim. 3:16-17) and that is met with an eternal reward (1 Cor. 15:58).

1) Account

- a) Eastern tribes return home after the conquest (v1-6) and build an altar (v10) & the western tribes prepare for war (v11-12).
- b) But first the western tribes send representatives (v13-14) saying the eastern tribes have tresspassed against God (v16), brought trouble upon the whole nation (v17-18), and should consider returning to the other side of Jordan (v19).
- c) To which the western tribes affirm God knows their intents and will accept punishment if they have turned from Him (v22-23), they built it as a sign of unity (v24-25), it was not for sacrifices (v26), and it was a witness between all that they were God's people (v27-28); so it was a sign of faithfulness, not sin (v29).
- d) Upon hearing this, all return home peacefully (v30-33).

2) Lessons

- a) Commuication is necessary Check what we think we know (Prov. 18:13; Deut. 13:13-15; James 1:19).
- b) Righteous must be alert to departures from the truth it is good to be watchful (Gal. 2:11, 6:1; Jude 3; Titus 1:10-11).
- c) Be careful in judgment check facts (Jn 7:24; Matt. 7:-1-2, 12)
- d) Think about the appearance of your actions Remember others watch you (Rom. 12:17; 1 Cor. 8:13; Phil. 2:15-16)
- e) Proper attitude one to another Be not puffed up but display love (Phil. 2:1-4; 1 Cor. 13:4-7)
- f) Strive for unity in the body (1 Cor. 12:25; 1:10)
