Taking a Vacation from God

It seems that most people go on some sort of vacation at least once per year. Many feel the need to “get away from it all.” This writer wonders if there are some who go on vacation to try to “get away from God” or their brothers and sisters in Christ. They may have the idea that if they are in a place where nobody knows who they are, they can “get away” with committing sin. Jonah thought he could run away from God and his responsibilities to Him, but he had to learn the hard way that he could not escape from God or his responsibilities to be faithful! (Jonah 1:1-4). This writer asks, “Are we Christians when we go on vacation, or is Christianity just something we do when we are ‘in town’?”

Do we skip services of the Lord’s church when we are on vacation? Are we thankful enough for God’s Sacrifice that we will assemble with the saints when they assemble to glorify Him? (Hebrews 10:25). Do we love and appreciate the Christian fellowship we can have with people from all over the world who “...have obtained like precious faith with us through the righteousness of God and our Saviour Jesus Christ”? (2 Peter 1:1; cf. 1 Corinthians 1:2). Is it too “grievous” for us to take a few hours out of our vacation week and give those hours to God? “For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous” (1 John 5:3). When the Ethiopian eunuch was on a long trip, he read his “Bible”! (Acts 8:27ff). Perhaps no Christian in the first century traveled more than the apostle Paul (Romans 15:19, 24-26). Can you imagine the Lord’s Day coming around and Paul thinking, “Well, I don’t really feel like going to services today; I think I’ll go to the beach”? Unless he was in prison, we know what Paul was doing on the first day of every week—he was gathering with the saints:

And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight (Acts 20:7).

Later on, as Paul was nearing the end of his life, he expressed total confidence in his salvation (2 Timothy 1:12; 4:6-8). The reason he had such confidence was because he knew he had been faithful to God, no matter what his geographic location had been! (1 John 2:3-5). Let us follow Paul’s example of faithfulness, as he followed Christ, and we can have that same confidence (1 Corinthians 11:1; Hebrews 10:23).

Do we dress immodestly when we are on vacation? Why do many of our brothers and sisters in Christ have the idea that it is appropriate to commit this sin in certain settings? If one goes to the beach, does that make it acceptable to violate 1 Timothy 2:9? “In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety...” (1 Timothy 2:9). What happens to that shamefacedness (bashfulness) that should be possessed at all times? Would you wear that bikini to the grocery store, or to Bible class? If not, why not? Where have we gotten this idea that it is OK to “show off our bodies” if we are in a certain setting, such as by the poolside or at the beach? The answer is this: That idea came from the world—

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“Withhold not good from them to whom it is due, when it is in the power of thine hand to do it. Say not unto thy neighbour, Go, and come again, and to morrow I will give; when thou hast it by thee.”

Proverbs 3:27-28

The modern prescription that many follow in order to “fulfill” their religious duties is to meet once or twice a week at a church building. Satan has successfully erected these mental road signs that attending worship and a Bible class is sufficient for the spiritual health of the next generation. Friends, that is not getting the job done! Parents continue to blindly march down the same road believing they have done enough. All the while, our young people continue marching out the back door of the church to embrace the world as Satan chalks up another win for his war. Our Christian religion has been sterilized down to three hours per week rather than a life of servanthood for Him.

Why would I say that Satan has our children in his hands? Consider the following study we recently conducted at Focus Press. The first was an anonymous study conducted on Facebook with 300 young people (the vast majority of whom identify themselves as New Testament Christians). In this research, 39% of the teens admitted to having viewed pornography online in recent months. That’s more than 1 out of every 3! Understand this question did not ask how many had ever viewed Internet pornography, as that number would likely be double. We were simply asking how many had viewed this sinful material recently. If 39% of our children admitted that they had viewed pornography recently, one can only wonder what the real num-

ber must be—and how many adults are viewing explicit material!

Also, 38% admitted to having cheated in school in the past few weeks. Parents may at first glance not consider this a big deal, but one wonders what type of ethical standard are we establishing for our young people? Are we rearing a generation of individuals who have bought into the lie of situational ethics—that right is not always right and wrong is not always wrong?

The curtain was pulled back on teens’ ethical standard in the next question. We asked how many believed that euthanasia—intentionally putting someone to death—was acceptable. For this question, 52% responded that they believed it would be acceptable to end someone’s life. This should send chills up the spines of parents who realize these are the

same children who will one day make surrogate decisions for their parents’ medical care.

Again let me remind you these are our children—young people who have been baptized in the church. And yet, 36% of them believe that homosexuality is just an alternative lifestyle. Have we totally missed instilling in our children what Almighty God views as an abomination? Even more surprising was that 43% indicated homosexuals should have the right to marry! The homosexual agenda has done a far better job at teaching our children tolerance than we have done at teaching them the Truth. You think the battle over same-sex marriage is over? If this is the view of Christian young people, consider where our society will be in 10-15 years when this generation begins voting and taking public office. Now, consider the direction the church is moving toward as these same individuals become deacons and elders in just a few short years.

The question that shocked us to the core was on the topic of abortion. We had assumed that within the church (and at home) Christian parents had done a fairly decent job on teaching about the sanctity of life and the fact that we were made in the image and likeness of God. And yet, 35% of our children believe abortion should be legal. Friends, society has waged a war on our children! It’s time parents and leaders recognize that our children’s souls are at stake—and act on it!

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it is worldliness affecting the Lord’s church (James 1:27; 4:4). Our bodies should be living sacrifices, not living spectacles!

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God (Romans 12:1-2).

Do we drink alcohol and “party” like worldly people when we are on vacation? Perhaps brethren think they can get away with such actions if they are out of town, but they are still sinning against God:

...he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God. For we have spent enough of our past lifetime in doing the will of the Gentiles--when we walked in lewdness, lusts, drunkenness, revelries, drinking parties, and abominable idolatries. In regard to these, they think it strange that you do not run with them in the same flood of dissipation, speaking evil of you. They will give an account to Him who is ready to judge the living and the dead (1 Peter 4:2-5 NKJV; cf. Galatians 5:19-21; Proverbs 23:31-32; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20; 1 Thessalonians 5:7-9, etc.).

It has been said that “character is who you are when nobody is looking.” However, God is always looking! “*Neither is there any creature that is not manifest in his sight: but all things are naked and opened unto the eyes of him with whom we have to do*” (Hebrews 4:13; cf. Ecc. 12:14; 2 Corinthians 5:10). When we are on vacation, do we think we are on vacation from God? We may be tempted to do many kinds of sinful things when on vacation, but let us be faithful to our Heavenly Father, whether we are on vacation or not!
