CONFEDERATE MONEY

During the Civil War, the Confederacy printed its own money. As the war raged on, this currency became less and less valuable. At one point a single bar of soap cost as much as \$50. By the end of the war, this money became worthless and good for little more than starting fires. Imagine for a moment that you are living during the Civil War. Although you are from the North, you are living in the South and have been able to accumulate a sizeable amount of Confederate money. Upon the end of the war, you intend to return to the North. You also happen to have inside information that the war could end any day and you know for a fact that the South is going to lose. What will you do with your Confederate money?

While this may seem like a strange question to ask 150 years removed from the end of the Confederacy, it is completely appropriate to help us properly understand the nature of our possessions. Every dime we possess is nothing more than Confederate money. It is useful today and may even provide us with a temporary sense of security, but a day is coming when it will be worthless. Imagine, someday a stack of one hundred dollar bills will be absolutely worthless. Jesus warns in Matthew 6:19, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasure on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal." What once was a fine set of clothes is now nothing more than rags. What was once a shiny new automobile that filled its owner with pride is now nothing more than a pile of rust that sits in a field with a tree growing inside. This change to worthlessness happens over time, but it also happens in an instant I have preached many funerals for rich men. As you stand beside their graves, you can't help but come face to face with the reality that all their money means nothing today. There is coming a time when the material things of this world will cease to even exist, but our souls will live on (2 Peter 3:10 -11). What will we do with our Confederate money?

Knowing about this impending worthlessness, we have the opportunity to send our treasure ahead of us. If I plan to return to the North and I know that all of these Confederate dollars are soon to be worthless, the first thing I will do is trade as much of it as I possibly can for U.S. dollars. That is exactly what Jesus advised us to do in regard to handling our soon-to-be-worthless possessions. He said in Matthew 6:20, "But lay up for yourselves treasures in Heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal." How do we lay up treasure in Heaven? By taking our possessions and using them for God's glory in the midst of this spiritual war that rages around us. We should be giving liberally to the Lord (2 Corinthians 8-9), helping those who are in need (Matthew 25:35-40), sacrificing for fellow Christians (Acts 4:34-35), supporting mission efforts (Philippians 4:18), and looking for ways that we can honor God with the possessions with which He has blessed us (Matthew 25:14-30). When we do those things, it will cost us some of our Confederate money, but we will only be trading it for

For at least three decades, Christians have been hoping the problem will silently fix itself. We have built sizeable buildings, paid youth ministers, sent foreign missionaries, and funded a veritable miasma [unwholesome atmosphere-RTS] of programs-all the while knowing in the back of our minds that there is a deadly "cancer" that is rapidly claiming thousands of souls. Insanity has been defined as "doing the same thing over and over expecting a different result," and yet, we continue doing the same thing silently, praying for a different result. I am convinced that the time has come to not only dissect and expose the problem but to eradicate it permanently.

During the historical period in which God delivered the Israelites through the hand of Moses, the Egyptians feared massive population of the children of Israel. God's hand had carried this dynasty from seventy (Genesis 46:27) to what has been estimated to be two million out of Egypt. Just prior to the introduction to Moses we discover an evil plot to wage war on the sons. The king of Egypt ordered the Hebrew midwives Shiphrah and Puah, "When you do the duties of a midwife for the Hebrew women and see them on the birthstools, if it is a son then you shall kill him but if it a daughter, then she shall live" (Exodus 1:16). They wanted to stop the increase and threat of the Israelites. Sim-

I often admonish preaching students in their classroom presentations to stop "circling the runway and just land the plane." While we should always strive to teach the "truth in love" and deliver messages tactfully, I am afraid that in many cases the truth has been so watered down that listeners cannot detect the real message. Or in other cases preachers wait so long to "land the plane" that they have effectively lost their audience before the point is communicated.

Please allow me to land the plane. Satan has our children in his hands and we are doing very little about it. Society has waged war on our children and is currently winning the battle. We hear lessons on being sober and vigilant "because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour" (1 Peter 5:8), and yet deep-down we believe that verse was written for other people not our children. I fully recognize the knee-jerk reaction is to say "Not my children," or to accuse me of wrongly judging your family. Have you considered lately what your children are putting into their hearts and minds? Have you looked around the auditoriums of many church buildings and noticed the departure of the younger generation? When will we address the problem and be Christian in word and deed! Isn't it time we admit there is a problem, and address it?

I have a financial advisor who handles investments and things of that nature. He constantly stresses the importance of thinking long term. Mutual funds are great investments if you are not going to need the money for 10 years. It would not be very smart to invest if you are going to need them next week. In regards to all of our possessions, we need to think long term-not ten or twenty years from now, but into eternity. Will our possessions be nothing more than a pile of rust that stands as a witness of condemnation against our souls because we "have lived luxuriously on the earth and led a life of wanton pleasure?" (James 5:1-6, NASB). Or will our possessions be a witness of righteousness that goes before us and awaits us in Heaven above? It all depends on what we do with our Confederate money.

Lessons Learned Too Late (Luke 16:19-31)

The rich man learned some lessons too late to benefit him; don't let the same happen to you.

1. Death is Certain.

- a. It comes to all (Eccl. 12:7, James 4:14, Heb. 9:27).
- b. Neither riches nor poverty would matter at this point (Lk. 12:15, 1 Tim. 6:7).

2. Judgment is Final.

- a. Each passed to their reward based on their lives (2 Cor. 5:10; Matt. 6:19-21). Lazarus to reward (2 Thess. 1:7, Rev. 21:4); the rich man to torment (Matt. 25:30, 41; 2 Thess. 1:7-9).
- b. They were in a set state, neither could change after life, and each state was just as long (Eccl. 9:6, 10; Matt. 25:46).

3. Eternity is Revealing.

- a. Revealed the value of the soul; the rich man suddenly becomes interested in the lost and desires their salvation (Mark. 8:34-37; Luke 15:7, 10, 32, James 5:20).
- b. Revealed the importance of following God; the living have everything they need to know and follow God (Rom. 1:20; John 20:30-31; 2 Pet. 1:3; 2 Tim. 3:16-17).
- c. What will we that are living do (Matt. 7:24, 21)?
