DAYATA TIME

One of the great travesties of the world today is the fact that many only live one day at a time and never look at the big picture of life. Even Christians many times do not look at the pattern that God has for their lives, living only a day at a time. There is however a picture that God wants us to see. A way that He has for His children to live, and to "paint the picture of life" that He has outlined for us to "fill in." Just like the coloring books we use to color when we were children. We only pass this way but once, and whatever we intend to do we must do it while we live physically. There is no doubt that God wants us to get serious about the "picture" we paint with our life. Our picture of life is to be painted with the "Christian Graces" that we find in the second letter of Peter chapter one, written to the them who "have obtained like precious faith."

The Christian Graces listed are: faith, virtue, knowledge, temperance, patience, godliness, brotherly kindness, and love (2 Pet.1:5-7), these are the colors. These are the very things that will 'paint our picture', actually define who we are. Then we are told; "For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that you shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 1:8). For us to have a bold picture, a beautiful fruitful picture, these things must be abundant in our lives. The only way our colors can be true and defined, is for us to be diligent in our painting. The Holy Spirit tells us, at the beginning of the picture to be diligent in the adding of these Graces; "And beside this, giving all diligence add to your faith...." (2 Pet.1:5). After we have painted our lives with these Graces, we are then told again to be diligent; "Wherefore the rather brethren give diligence to make your calling and election sure: (10). To be diligent we must be constant in our effort to accomplish and finish the work to be done. We must be able to see the whole picture, the end result. We must be persistent and enthusiastic in our application of these colors to our lives. We do not just go a get a 'dose' of these graces and call it good; there would be no definition in our picture. These graces cannot be purchased or inherited. We must individually paint and mold our lives with these colors, these qualities. It will take a lifetime, and for that, we must be persistent in our application.

Now for those who choose to live one day at a time, and refuse to see their 'finished picture,' because of their lack of effort to apply the colors, Peter issues a warning; "But he that lacks these things is blind and cannot see afar off, and has forgotten that he was purged from his old sins" (2 Pet.1:9). When we were baptized for the remission of our sins, that was not the end of the picture, it was only the beginning. Those who have been baptized and continue without developing their 'picture,' they are blind. That is the condition of the Christian who

lives one day at a time – he cannot see, or he simply will not see afar off.

Peter gives us some great news about our diligent effort in developing our 'picture:' "For if you do these things you shall never fall. For so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly, into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." If we paint our picture with these colors, the qualities that God has given us to use, and be diligent to the end to complete the picture; "we will never fall." When our picture of life is complete, and we have painted it according to God's outline, we will hear those beautiful words; "Well done thou good and faithful servant you have been faithful over a few things I will make you ruler over many things" (Mt.25:14-30).

Creation Fact #131 Evidence from Earth's Ecology

Hazardous materials are not just manmade phenomenon, but also a natural part of creation. For example, uranium and other radioactive elements occur naturally in the environment and can be dissolved in ground water. Chlorofluorocarbons are spewed from volcanoes. Dioxins occur naturally with every forest fire. One might expect a well-designed creation to have the ability to process hazardous materials into harmless substances. Scientists are learning that this is exactly the case with several types of bacteria which decontaminate water containing dissolved uranium. One species of bacteria makes uranium phosphate crystals by combining the phosphate in the water with the uranium. The crystals are stored harmlessly within the bacteria. Another species uses enzymes to make a uranium ore, which settles harmlessly out of the water. Scientists have also discovered a type of bacteria that breaks down chlorofluorocarbons.

The hazardous chemicals in the environment are a reminder that we no longer live in a perfect environment, but that our world has been affected by the curse of the Fall. Yet the earth is still full of abundant evidence that it is a well-designed system. By studying nature, scientists are learning how to clean up mankind's messes.

Upcoming Events



They That Mourn (Matthew 5:4)

Mourning follows the humility of being poor in spirit by recognizing our spiritual condition apart from God because of sin.

1. RECOGNIZES THE DESPAIR OF SIN

- a. One who realizes he is lost in sin without hope of his own (Isa. 59:1-2; Rom. 6:23, 3:23; Eph. 2:1, 12).
- b. One who does not boast of sin but is heart broken by it (1 Cor. 5:2, Ps. 119:136; Lk 7:37-38; Matt. 26:75).
- c. One that freely confessions the guilt of sin without excuses
 (2 Sam. 12:13; Ps. 51:1-3; Ps. 51:17; Dan. 9:5; Ezra 10:1;
 Luke 18:13; Luke 15:21).
- d. One who understands the contrast between a holy God and sinful man (Isa. 6:5; Rom. 7:24).

2. RECOGNIZES THE ONE SOURCE OF COMFORT.

- a. Answer is salvation in Christ (Rom 8:1; Eph. 2:1, 6; 1:7).
- b. Recognizes mourning must lead to repentance (2 Cor. 7:6-13).
- c. Recognizes the need to follow Christ in obeying the gospel (Rom. 10:9-10, Gal. 3:27; Acts 2:38) or being restored (1 John 1:9; Acts 8:22).
- d. End result is forgiveness of sin and God's comfort (James 4:8-10; Acts 8:39; Matt. 11:28-30).

Anticipating Heaven

Heaven should always be our goal in this life (Col. 3:1-2), a wonderful place that can be described as:

- 1. **Home** Not this world which is temporary (2 Pet. 3:10; Phil. 3:20; 1 Pet. 2:11; Heb. 11:3; 1 Thess. 4:14, 17).
- 2. **Rest** A place of comfort (Matt. 11:28-30; 2 Thess. 6-7; Rev. 14:13).
- 3. **Eternal** A place that will last forever (Matt. 25:46; John 3:16; 2 Cor. 5:1; 1 Thess.4:17).
- 4. **Prepared** A home Jesus promised to prepare and take us to (Matt. 25:34, John 14:1-3) that all the faithful could anticipate (Heb. 11:10).
- 5. **Glorious** Beautiful beyond description (Heb. 10:34; Rev. 21:1-5, 22:1-5) where sin and darkness cannot invade (Rev. 21:8, 27; 22:5).
- 6. **Optional** Prepared place for prepared people but with an open invitation (Matt. 11:28-30; Rev. 22:17). Our manner of life determines if we are prepared (Rev. 22:14-15; Matt. 7:21).
