WHERE ARE WE LOOKING?

It is easy for the Christian to become discouraged as he goes through this life. One is certain to face disappointments, difficulties, temptations, and other problems along the way. We have to remember, however, that these are all things that we can overcome as long as we keep our focus. I want you to consider for a moment the Christian's focus in terms of a race. We see this type of imagery used in the Bible; consider, for example, Paul's exhortation to the Corinthians, "Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain" (1 Corinthians 9:24). Paul was encouraging them to "run" the Christian race with a mind set on winning—the prize being eternal life. Any runner will tell you, if you are determined to win, you must keep your eyes focused in the right direction, on the finish line, the goal towards which you strive. So in terms of race, the Christian, too, must keep his eyes on the goal. So ask yourself, "Where am I looking?"

Are you looking behind?

It is easy for the Christian to start to look behind himself. There are two ways in which one might do this. First, one can look into his past and worry and fret about what is behind him. He might find himself constantly worrying about things of the past or worrying that past sins have condemned him even though he has repented of them. There is a continual remembrance of things he has done in the past even though he has done everything he can to correct those things and leave them behind.

The other way we can look behind us is to look at what we have accomplished in our lives and get haughty. We might think that in some way we have "arrived," that we have finished the race, or that we have somehow done enough. We allow pride to convince us that we have done enough for God and it is time for someone else to work.

Both of these attitudes reflect a problem in the Christian life that could have troubled Paul. He was one that, in the past, persecuted the church but did not let that keep him from serving God. Later he could have looked at all that he had done and just been satisfied and given up. Instead he expresses his attitude to the Philippians, "Brethren, I count not myself yet to have laid hold: but one thing I do, forgetting the things which are behind, and stretching forward to the things which are before" (Philippians 3:13). He neither dwelt in past sin nor reveled in past accomplishments—he just kept on running the Christian life.

Are you looking sideways?

Rather, maybe we are looking sideways at the others running beside us. This can be a great distraction for the runner; he can't take the time to see where others are as he must keep pressing forward regardless. For the Christian, this might be done by comparing ourselves to others about us. We might say to our-

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selves, "I am doing better than so-and-so over there" or "At least I am not doing what they are doing." It is almost as if we begin to judge or decide our level of service to God based on the actions of others about us, instead of being faithful to God according to His Word. Joshua was not looking sideways when he said to his fellow countrymen, "...choose you this day whom ye will serve...but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15). He was going to serve the Lord regardless of what the others around him did.

Are you looking downward?

Additionally, we have to ask ourselves if we are looking downward. A runner that is looking down cannot see obstacles ahead, he has no goal to strive for, and is setting himself up for an accident and defeat. But, how easy it is in the Christian life to get caught up in the things that are going on right here, right now, in this present world. We begin putting emphasis on physical concerns rather than on spiritual. We allow our service to God to be sidetracked by caring for the concerns of this temporary life instead of our eternal life. A runner will train with weights on his ankles but when it comes time for the race he will lay all of those things aside so that he will not be hindered. In the same way, the Hebrews writer says we have to lay aside the concerns of this world - "Wherefore, seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us" (Hebrews 12:1). We have to remember there are a great number of faithful Christians that have already run this race and their example provides encouragement for us to keep our focus on the goal. Both Jesus and Paul were excellent examples in the New Testament; when eminent death awaited them they steadfastly set their faces on doing the will of God. They refused to get caught up in this life and instead put the fear and pain of death aside and went onward.

Or, are you looking onward?

So the real question is are we looking onward? The runner has to keep looking ahead, keep looking at the goal before him, and keep his focus. As a Christian we must do the same thing. Remember to keep pressing forward, remember the gift of eternal life that is set before us, remember to keep our focus on our spiritual reward. Paul reminds Christians to, "Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians **3:2).** We are to run the race that is laid out before each of us and to fight the good fight (cf. 2 Timothy 4:7)—not dwelling on the things of the past (i.e. looking behind). We are to compare ourselves with the Bible and find areas in our lives that need improvement (cf. James 1:25) -not looking to man for our measuring stick (i.e. looking sideways). We are to remain focused on our spiritual lives (cf. Matthew 6:33)—not getting caught up in the things of this life (i.e. looking downward). And we are to strive to do what the Bible commands and thereby be pleasing unto God (cf. Colossians 3:17), following His Will (cf. Matthew 7:21), no matter what besets us (cf. Revelation 2:10) (i.e. looking onward).


