Covetousness

Covetousness is a mindset found in the Old and New Testaments and is listed as one of the blackest sins. Just what is covetousness?

There are various shades of meaning in Scripture. The general meaning is "the inordinate desire to have more things than one possesses." I usually say covetousness is when a man's desire for *things* outruns his desire to please God. For example, Luke 12:16-21 is the account of the man who, when abundantly blessed by God, could only think of himself. He had the ability to help others, but let material things make him selfish.

Sometimes it means, "A calculated effort to acquire gain through dishonest, unfair, and unscrupulous means." Paul was thinking of this when he penned, "For neither at any time used we flattering words, as ye know, nor a cloke of covetousness; God is witness" (1 Thess.2:5). I would put gambling in this category, wherein a man would try to take another man's possessions by a game of chance. The man never hopes to lose his possessions, and gambles in hopes of acquiring another's possessions without working for them. Covetousness is behind it all.

Sometimes covetousness is just loving money too much. The Pharisees were covetous (Lk. 16:14). Paul wrote that". . . in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous. . . ," and he used the word covetousness in this way when he wrote, "I have coveted no man's silver, or gold, or apparel" (Acts 20:33).

Desire is natural, but covetousness is unnatural. When my desire for money and things is stronger than my desire to be honest, charitable, or to show kindness or genuine sympathy to others, 1'm guilty of the sin of covetousness. Is it serious to be guilty of this? Yes: "... Take heed, and beware of covetousness; for a man's life does not consist in the abundance of the things which he possesses" (Lk. 12:15). "But now I have written unto you not to keep company, if any man that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater. . . with such an one not to eat" (I Cor. 5:11). "Mortify therefore your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness. . . and covetousness which is idolatry" (Col. 3:5).

The truth about covetousness makes it so important that I attend worship services faithfully. I need to be constantly exposed to good people and to the teaching of God's word in order to keep my perspective clear. What really matters in life is not things-it's people and their relationship to God. True success can only be defined one way ultimately: Living your life and going to heaven.



And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment: So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.

When Is A Good Time To Pray?

The bible refers to Jesus and His prayer life sixty-two times. Closer examination reveals twenty-two separate prayers recorded in the life of Christ. If We study Christ's prayers, we find that they cover the breadth of prayers Christians today might pray. Let us examine these twenty-two prayers and learn to pray like Jesus.



Jesus Prayed...

- When He came out of the waters of baptism (Luke 3:21). We should begin praying immediately after our conversion and never stop.
- When His soul was troubled (John 12:27). Prayer mad do more than a doctor's pill or a counselor's bill.
- When He was alone (Luke 9:18). Quiet times are rare for some, and constant for others. Either way, take advantage of solace of prayer.
- When He would soon be in God's presence (Luke 9:28). Saturday night is a good time to pray about Sunday morning.
- When He was busy (Luke 5:16). Too busy to take time for prayer? Re-prioritize.
- On ordinary days (Mark 1:35). We set our alarms for work, ball games, golf, shopping, and recreation. Jesus set His to pray. Our daily autobiography needs both the prologue and epilogue of prayer.

- When He was about to suffer (Matthew 26:41).
- For children (Matthew 19:13). In a world of temptations, dangers, and opportunities, our children and grandchildren need us to wrap them in the mantle of prayer. Too, take time to pray for those who don't have parents who pray.
- When He completed a work (John 19:30).
- When He had to make a big decision (Luke 6:12-13). Choosing a companion, college, congregation, or career? Pray first.
- When He faced the death of a loved one (John 11:41). Death hurts; prayer helps.
- When He received blessing (Luke 24:30-32).
- In frustration over soul-winning (Matthew 11:25). Every soul winner feels discouraged at times. Pray for wisdom, patience, and opportunity. Pray for God to spare the person long enough for a change to be made.

- When He was facing death (Luke 23:46).
- When He was happy (Luke 10:21). Share joy with the One who brings it.
- In the presence of others (Luke 11:1). What could be more appropriate?
- When He was sad (Matthew 14:23). Nothing calms our troubled hearts like prayer.
- For His enemies (Luke 23:34-35).
- Before accomplishing His greatest feats (Matthew 14:19; 15:36). We should pray before competitions, elections, career choices, and promotion opportunities. Too, a good prayer life helps us accomplish more when we did not anticipate great opportunities.
- **In worship** (Matthew 26:27). Pray with the one leading, just as you sing with the song leader.
- When He was concerned over His disciples (John 17). Prayer makes a difference in others.

The Bible is filled with glorious examples of faith in action. It is faith that gives purpose to the lives of God's children, and inspiration for the heroic deeds of the martyrs who have died for the cause of Christ. In fact it is the motivating principle back of every act of acceptable obedience, and Christian service. Why did some reject the word of Christ? They did not believe in Him. Why did others love, obey and serve Him? They believed in Him with all their heart and soul. Faith that is too weak to lead one to obey God is worthless. "For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth anything, nor uncircumcision, but faith which worketh by love," (Gal. 5:6).

FAITH ALONE IS NEVER SUFFICIENT

- 1. Faith without love is worthless (1 Cor. 13:2). Such was true of the miraculous faith that could move mountains, and it is just as true of the common faith today.
- 2. Faith without confession will result in our denial (John. 12:42; Mt. 10:32).
- 3. Faith without turning cannot save (Acts 11:21).
- 4. Faith without works is dead, being alone (Jas. 2:24).
- 5. Faith without repentance and baptism does not result in salvation and remission of sins (Mk. 16: 16; Acts 2:38).
- 6. Christ gives the believer power to become a son of God, "But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on Him" (John. 1:12).

Studies For The Week of February 13th:

Sunday Class......2 Corinthians (Chap. 6-7)

Wednesday Class Zephaniah (Intro./Ch. 1)

Caution, Ostacles Ahead! (Matthew 7:15-23)

- 1. Warning There Are False Prophets (v15)
 - a. Warnings remind us to take caution; Jesus reminds us some would detract us from the right way (2 Cor. 11:13-14; 1 Pet. 5:8).
 - b. Many other warnings abound (cf. Acts 20:28-30; Gal. 1:6-9; 1 Tim. 4:1-3; 2 Tim. 4:3-4; 1 John 4:1).
- 2. **Help** Know What To Look For (v16-20)
 - a. If we don't know what to look for, confusion follows; but we have a standard (John 17:17, 12:48).
 - b. Jesus says to be fruit inspectors—we can't look at one's motives but we can see their actions which will lead them and those who follow to destruction.
 - c. We can compare what they teach with the word of God (Acts 20:27, 31-32; Gal. 1:9; ! Tim. 4:6-7, 11, 13, 15-16; 2 Tim. 3:15-17, 4:2, 2:15, 1 John 4:2-3; 2 John 7-11).
- 3. *Importance* They will be judged and so will we (v21-23)
 - a. There are dangerous consequences for ignoring warnings.
 - b. Reminds us that all will be judged and so need to follow what is right (2 Cor. 5:10; Acts 17:11, 2 Tim. 2:15).
 - c. Some will be surprised but such does not have to be the case (Rom. 10:2; 2 Thess. 1:7-9; 1 John 5:3).

Take care that you are not distracted from the strait and narrow!

Dealing With Criticism

- 1. People WILL find fault with you (Matt. 11:16-19).
- 2. People critizied Jesus, a sinless man...
 - a. He associated with the wrong people (Matt. 9:11)
 - b. He was too common (Matt. 13:55)
 - c. He did not come from a good community (John 1:46)
 - d. He carred for sinners (Luke 7:36-39)
 - e. He healed on the Sabbath (John 5:1-6)
 - f. He broke their traditions (Mark 7:2-3, 6-7)
- 3. Reactions To Criticism
 - a. Don't invite it (1 Pet. 4:12, 15).
 - b. Live above it (1 Pet. 2:11-12)
 - c. Suffer/Endure it (1 Pet. 3:17; 1 Pet. 2:20)
 - d. Weigh it based on its merit (2 Cor. 13:5)
 - e. Don't cease doing right (Prov. 23:23; Matt. 13:21; Gal. 1:10; Matt. 4:10, 5:10-12).
- 4. A Word to the Critical
 - a. Look to yourself first (Matt. 7:3-5)
 - b. Think about what we say (James 1:19)
 - c. Let love guide in speaking the truth (Eph. 4:15; 1 Cor. 13)
