# THE DEAD SEA CHRISTIAN

The "Dead Sea" the name given by Greek writers of the second century to that inland sea called in Scripture the "salt sea" (Gen. 14:3; Num. 34:12), the "sea of the plain" (Deut. 3:17), the "east sea" (Eze. 47:18; Joel 2:20), and simply "the sea" (Eze. 47:8). The Arabs call it Bahr Lut, that is, the Sea of Lot.

The Dead Sea lies about 16 miles in a straight line to the east of Jerusalem. Its surface is 1,292 feet below the surface of the Mediterranean Sea. It covers an area of about 300 square miles. Its depth varies from 1,310 to 11 feet. From various phenomena that have been observed, its bottom appears to be still subsiding. It is about 53 miles long, and of an average breadth of 10 miles.

The waters of the Dead Sea contain 24.6 percent of mineral salts, about seven times as much as in ordinary seawater; thus the waters of this sea are unusually buoyant. Chloride of magnesium is most abundant; next to that chloride of sodium (common salt). There are also many other minerals that exists in the waters of the Dead Sea. The presence of this large quantity of matter in the water is due to there being no outlet, the great heat of that region causing such rapid evaporation that its

average depth, notwithstanding the rivers that run into it, is maintained with little variation. The Jordan alone discharges into it no less than six million tons of water every twenty-four hours. The waters which flow into it can only escape by evaporation. The Dead Sea receives but never gives. Because of this, nothing living can exist in this sea. It is a dead sea.



Many Christians are like the Dead Sea. We have received rivers of blessings; but many, keep these blessings to themselves allowing them to evaporate - leaving them spiritually lifeless. Beloved, we have been blessed with health, family, and our physical needs. Most importantly, though, we have been blessed with spiritual blessings. Paul said, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ," (Eph. 1:3).

What should we be giving so as not to become a Dead Sea Christian? First, we must be as the church in Macedonia who "first gave of themselves to the Lord" (2 Cor. 8:5). This is the pivotal first step in the life of giving - for without this mentality we will be as the Dead Sea - selfish and lifeless. This is why we are to seek the things of God first (Mt. 6:33).

We must also be giving as we have prospered on every first day of the week (1 Cor. 16:1-2). Paul said, "So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). This should be especially easy for us knowing "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich" (2 Cor. 8:9). Give sacrificially (2 Cor. 8:3).

We also need to be giving, setting forth, a good Christian example, on a daily basis, to our peers. Jesus said, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Mt. 5:16). Only Dead Sea Christians would fail to let their light shine among their family, friends, and co-workers. Remember we are the Lord's epistle read and known among men (2 Cor. 3:2).

Finally, we need to give, share, the gospel to a lost and dying world. The giver of the spiritual waters of life (Jn. 4:10-14) said, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mt. 28:18-19). Are we sharing the good news of the gospel with those around about us?

Are you sharing the rivers of blessings, or are you a Dead Sea Christian?

# HANDLING DISAGREEMENTS

Anyone can be involved in an argument. Paul and Barnabas are reminders that even faithful brethren are not immune from having disagreements (Acts 15:35-41). Occasionally, our disagreements get out of hand and we end up saying things we later regret. So what are some safeguards we can use in handling disagreements in a Christian way? Here are a few suggestions from the book of Proverbs:

**Be friendly**. Try not to be adversarial in your point of view. "He that hath friends must shew himself friendly" and "A friend loveth at all times" (Proverbs 18:24; 17:17).

Ever use kindness. Cordiality goes a long way towards maintaining tranquility. "A soft answer turneth away wrath but grievous words stir up anger" (Proverbs 15:1).

Let up some. Most disagreements would remain friendly if we would just back off a little. "...but he that refraineth his lips is wise" (Proverbs 10:19).

Overcome with good. Oftentimes in the heat of an argument we lash out in retaliation. "Say not, I will do so to him as he hath done to me" (Proverbs 24:29).

Value their opinion. Listen attentively to what others have to say. "He that answereth a matter before he heareth it, it is folly and shame unto him" (Proverbs 18: 13).

**Introduce soothing words**. You can get your point across in a nice way. "Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones" (Proverbs 16:24).

Never engage irate behavior. If a disagreement becomes ugly---conversation over! "Put away from thee a forward mouth, and perverse lips put far from thee" (Proverbs 4:24).

**Grow taller**. The desire to win an argument often escalates it. Bigger people will refuse. "...therefore leave off contention, before it be meddled with" (Proverbs 17:14).

# Search the Scriptures

Be like the Bereans who "received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so." [Acts 17:11]

#### What Do You Want On Your Tombstone?

All will die and stand in judgment (Heb. 9:27); but how will you be remembered? Will any of these epitaths fit you?

- 1. Asleep in Jesus (1 Cor. 15:18; 1 Thess. 4:13-14)
- 2. At Rest (Rev. 14:13; Matt. 16:27; John 5:28-29; 2 Cor. 5:10)
- 3. Though Dead, Yet Speaketh (Heb. 11:4; Phil. 2:14-16)
- 4. Walked With God (Gen. 5:24; 1 John 1:7; Matt. 7:21)
- 5. A Good Man (Acts 11:23-24)
- 6. A Devout Man (Acts 10:2)
- 7. Kept the Faith (2 Tim. 4:7)
- 8. Faithful Unto Death (Rev. 2:10; Heb. 12:4)
- 9. Faithful Servant (Matt. 25:21, 23)

Our tombstone is temporary (2 Pet. 3:11), what matters is will these things be true descriptions of our lives before God?

#### **Proper Attitudes Towards Sin (Part 1)**

- 1. Admit It Rather than denying it or blaming others
  - a. Admit guilt (Rom. 3:23; 1 John 1:8-10; Ps. 51:3, 32:5; Prov. 28:13).
  - b. Recognize responsibility (Gen. 3:12-13; Ex. 32:22; 1 Sam. 15:13-15; Jms 1:13-15; Gal. 2:11-12; Ps. 51:1-5).
- **2.** Hate It Rather than mocking or loving it
  - a. Want nothing to do with it; come full circle in thinking about sin as God does (Amos 5:15; Ps. 97:10; Prov. 8:13; Eph. 5:1).
  - b. Remember God hates sin (Prov. 6:16-19, 8:13; Mark 3:5; John 2:13-17; Heb. 1:9; Ps. 45:6-7).
  - c. But ensure that we hate the sin and love the person (Ps. 101:3; Jude 23; Rev. 2:6, 15; John 3:16; Rom. 5:8).
  - d. Remember the costs of sin (1 Pet. 2:24; 1 Pet. 3:18; Gen. 2:17; Rom. 6:23).
  - e. Remember the attitue toward sin and the attitue toward God are inversely linked (Ps. 97:10; Matt. 6:24).
- 3. Avoid It Rather than dismiss it and continue in it
  - a. Those priased by God were those who removed themselves from sin (Job 1:1; Ps. 1:1-2).
  - b. Abohor it (Rom. 12:9)
  - c. Abstain from it (1 Thess. 5:21-22; 1 Thess. 4:3; 1 Pet. 2:11; Acts 15:29)
  - d. Ask for help in avoid it (Matt. 6:13; Luke 22:40, 46)
  - e. Don't make provision for it (Rom. 13:14).
