

Search the Scriptures

Be like the Bereans who "received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so." (Acts 17:11)

Studies for the week of April 17, 2011

A Burning Fire

Jeremiah said the word of God was as a "burning fire" in his bones (Jer. 20:9); recent wildfires can teach us some important spiritual lessons concerning this description of God's Word:

- 1. Fire Is Powerful-drastically alters what it contacts
 - a. God's Word does so in a good way as it has the power to save (Rom. 1:16; 1 Pet. 1:22-23; 2 Tim. 3:15; Acts 20:32; 1 Cor. 15:1-4); convict (Heb. 4:12; Titus 1:9; Eph. 6:17); and unite (Eph. 3:6-7).
- 2. Fire Spreads Rapidly—hard to contain
 - a. Jeremiah found the same was true with God's Word.
 - b. The first century example was one of spreading the word of God, not containing it (Acts 5:19-20; Matt. 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16; Acts 8:4; 2 Tim. 4:2; Titus 2:1, 11-15).
- **3. Fire Is Intense-**consumes everything around it
 - a. This attitude is seen in the apostle Paul (Phil. 3:13-14); a passion that should be in us all (Phil. 3:17; Col. 3:2).
 - b. Do we have any intensity (Rev. 3:15-16, 19)?
 - c. Has it changed us (Col. 3:1-3; Rom. 12:1-2)?

4. Fire Destroys...but creates room for new growth

- a. Jeremiah was told to root out the bad that you can build up the good (Jer. 1:9-10).
- b. Still today the gospel will both tear down and build up (2 Tim. 3:16-17; 4:2).
- c. Specifically there are things that must be removed (Rom. 6:4a, 6; Col. 3:3, 5-9) and there are things that must be added (Rom. 6:4-5; Col. 3:10-17; Gal. 2:20).

Helps In Overcoming Sin

- 1. God's Word—the inspired (2 Tim. 3:16-17) truth (John 17:17) that makes one free (John 8:31-32) and records what God would have us know for life and godliness (2 Pet. 1:3). Will keep one's steps (Ps. 119:11; 37:31; Matt. 4:1-11; 1 John 2:1, 3:9; 1 Pet. 1:23) and is to be used as a guide (Jer. 10:23; Ps. 119:105; 2 Tim. 3:16) reading, studying, mediting upon, and memorizing it (1Tim 4:13; 2Tim 2:15; Ps 119:97).
- **2. Prayer** Petition God (Matt. 6:13; Lk. 21:36), necessary in standing firm along with the armor of God (Eph. 6:13, 18), and is needed regularly (Lk. 18:1; 1 Thess. 5:17; Col. 4:2).
- **3. Self-Examination** A regular checkup on our spiritual course (Col. 3:2; 1 Cor. 11:28; 2 Cor. 13:5-6) that uses God's Word as our standard of right (James 1:22-25).
- **4. Reverential Fear of God** due awe and respect unto our sovereign God (Ex. 20:20; Prov. 3:7, 1:&; Eccl. 12:13); moves us to submit to the One who can both bless and curse but wants to bless us (Heb. 10:31; Rom. 11:22; 2 Cor. 5:11; Acts 10:34-35; 1 Tim. 2:4; Titus 2:11-12).
- **5.** Omniscience/Omnipotence of God Remember that He is all knowing and all seeing (Prov. 15:3; Ps. 139:7); forgetting this emboldens one in sin (Jer. 23:23-24; Ps. 94:1-11).
- **6. Watching Our Influences**—What occupies our time and thoughts (Prov. 4:23; Lk. 6:45; Phil. 4:8)? Who influences us (1 Cor. 15:33; Deut. 20:16-18; Neh. 13:26)?
- **7.** Uncertainty of Time the reminder that this could be our last day (James 4:14; 5:17-19).
