What To Expect When You Visit Our Worship Service

We in churches of Christ take seriously the Lord's words in *John 4:24*: "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." The word of God, and specifically, the New Testament of Jesus Christ (*Heb. 8:6-13*), is our standard of truth for acceptable worship (*John 17:17*). God has not left it up to us to do as whatever we please when we approach him; through the inspired apostles of Christ he has directed the church in the manner in which we are to worship him. Our goal is to do as the early church, which "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers" (*Acts 2:42*). This makes our worship distinctive from what most are accustomed to seeing in other churches.

Because we are committed to following the God-given, apostolic pattern for worship, we praise God in song, "teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs" (*Col. 3:16*). Our singing is not accompanied by a piano or band or other forms of instrumental music because we do not find authority for these additions in the New Testament. We learn from God's word the church is to sing (*Eph. 5:19*), and we do not add to what

God has instructed us to do or go beyond the authority of his word (1 Cor. 4:6; Rev. 22:18-19). While most visitors find our a cappella singing unusual, they also find the four part harmonies beautiful and edifying.

We learn from apostolic example and instruction to the early church that God's people are to observe the Lord's supper when they meet every first day of the week (*Acts 20:7*; *1 Cor. 11:23-29*), and so each Sunday we partake of the unleavened bread and fruit of the vine in remembrance of the sacrifice of Christ. Also, our members give into a collection for the work of God's kingdom in accordance with the teaching of God's word (*1 Cor. 16:1-2*).

In our worship assembly we also offer prayer to our Heavenly Father in the name of his Son Jesus Christ, and listen to the preaching of the life-changing, soul saving gospel of Christ (*Rom. 1:16*). Our preaching is Bible-based, for we are to "speak as the oracles of God," (*1 Pet. 4:11*). We are committed to exalting God by teaching and preaching "the whole counsel of God" (*Acts 20:27*) and citing book, chapter and verse as we exalt God and focus on hearing his will for our lives revealed in the scriptures.

You will also find a warm welcome from friendly folks who want to help you understand God's will for your life and his plan for your salvation so that you can be sure you are saved by His grace and have the hope of eternal life. The war against God's design for the family rages on

"Times have changed," said Jennifer Aniston in an interview about her new movie The Switch. The A-list actress explained: "The point of the movie is, what is it that defines family? Love is love, and family is what is around you. That is what I love about this movie. It is saying [family] is not the traditional sort of stereotype of what we have been taught as a society....Women are realizing...they don't have to settle with a man just to have that child."

If you're wondering what she's talking about, in The Switch Aniston plays an unmarried woman who decides to have a child by artificial insemination—in other words, without a relationship of any kind with the father of the child. In this year's The Back-up Plan, another popular Jennifer (Lopez) plays in a similar story about a woman who uses insemination to have a child sans husband. Yet another film in theaters right now, The Kids Are Alright, is about a lesbian couple raising their two teenagers, conceived by one of them through (you guessed it) artificial insemination.

Meanwhile, district Judge Vaughn Walker struck down Proposition 8, an amendment to the California State Constitution defining marriage as the union of one

man to one woman. Thus with a stroke of the pen, the federal judge dismissed millennia of societal norms and the universal practice of humanity as irrelevant to our understanding of what constitutes a marriage. He went further, in fact, declaring in his decision that the majority of Californians had no legal, moral, or pragmatic grounds on which to limit marriage to a husband and wife, and that therefore the only consideration that could have motivated millions of voters was unbridled bigotry.

If this weren't enough, Governor David Patterson just signed a bill making New York the last of the fifty states legalizing no-fault divorce. Thus, the Empire State has belatedly joined the other forty-nine in making it easier to weasel out of a marriage contract than it is to get out of a mortgage.

These are just some of the latest developments in the ongoing effort to deconstruct and supplant the traditional concept of family. The assaults on the home from pop culture, radical activists, the mainstream media, and the government are disturbing enough. But now reproductive technology has made it possible to pervert the natural order and permit the conception of children without any relationship—or even direct contact—between mother and father, further facilitating the rise of "alternative" arrangements to the traditional family.

The "stereotype" of family that Anniston celebrates liberation from and which our courts are seeking to undermine is the natural, God-given order: one man, one woman, raising their children together in the context of the lifelong commitment of marriage (*Gen. 2:18-25*; *Mat. 19:9*). Easy divorce, intentional single-motherhood, homosexual "marriage"—these are all rejections of the divine model for the home. They are arrogant, self-serving, and foolish declarations that kids don't really need their moms and dads to raise them together in the same home, that they don't really need to be raised by their fathers at all.

This redefining of family is a cavalier dismissal of the mountain of social-science research which conclusively documents that kids do best when they are raised by both of their biological parents. Most importantly, it is a rejection of God's design for our homes, which he created and ordered for our well-being. It is a result of our abandonment of God himself, the creeping secular idolatry of our age (*Rom. 1:18-32*). It is social suicide.

This is no mere tampering with trifling matters on the periphery of our lives. The home is the bedrock for all society, and dismantling God's order for the family has disastrous repercussions for all of us—especially our children. The need is great for the church to declare that the home is no mere social convention that may be arbitrarily reengineered at will without grave consequences. Rather, it is the creation of God for our good and his glory. The answer to the ills facing our families is not to supplant God's plan for the home, but to defend and embrace it.

Yes, Mrs. Anniston, "Times have changed." But the divine design for the home has not, and we ignore it at our peril.
