## What Does Christ Look Like?

The question was always posed, what does Christ look like? Many answers were given; He's a white man with a crown of thorns with spots of blood and beach towel around His waist. Some pictured Him as a black man with an afro and blood running down His side waiting to die. Some even has Him as a Spaniard with female angels flying around Him on the cross. So many over the years have proclaimed they have seen Him in various places, in their trees, food, in shapes of clouds and the foolishness continues. *NONE OF THIS CAN BE VALIDATED!* We could carry on till we have exhausted every theory and opinion out there, however, what does the bible reveal concerning His looks? Can we truly look like Him once we find Him?

In Isaiah fifty-three, the Messianic prophet stated this concerning the Suffering Servant, "For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, [there is] no beauty that we should desire him", the Messiah was not going to be someone who would stick out in the crowds with His appearance (53:2). "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem..., Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men" (Matt. 2:1, 16). Mary, the mother of Jesus gave birth to Him and notice when Herod was fooled he decreed for all the babies two years old and under to be killed! We can safely conclude that Jesus as a baby looked like the rest of the babies of His time. One Sabbath day, Jesus was in the Temple teaching and notice the response of His critics, "Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary, the brother of James, and Joses, and of Juda, and Simon? and are not his sisters here with us?..." (Mark 6:3). Apparently Jesus must have resembled His siblings in some fashion. When John saw Jesus coming, he identified God's sacrifice for sin by saying "behold the Lamb of God which take away the sin of the world" (John 1:29).

So what does Jesus look like today? We could continue to notice passages as found in Revelation chapter one and verse fourteen which uses anthropomorphic language, but that wouldn't be sufficient for us to pattern ourselves after. Furthermore, does the Father truly want us to imitate Him in the physical or in the spiritual (I Pet. 2:21)? How can we follow Christ if we're not sure of what He looks like? God is Spirit... Jesus said, if you have seen Me, you have seen the Father... (John 4:24; 14:9)! Like us Jesus was a spiritual being wrapped in flesh, he went



Finally, then, brothers, we ask and urge you in the Lord Jesus, that as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God, just as you are doing, that you do so more and more.

about doing spiritual things which the bible calls good (Acts 10:38). He was the One who stated, "I always do that which pleases Him" (John 8:29). So let's explore more of the Christ!

Jesus had the correct mindset according Philippians chapter two and that is putting others before self, this was seen even before the foundation of the world when the determinate counsel acknowledged Him to be the sacrifice for man's sin. Christ never was involved with a power struggle with the Father in Heaven, which suggest He didn't have an unlawful pride issue (2:6). He listened to people on many occasions, the man with the mute son, the woman with the issue of blood, and even to the men who accused the woman of adultery (Mark 9; Mark 5; Jn. 8). He was compassionate to many, when Israel was being malnourished by its leaders He said they were like sheep without a shepherd (Matt. 9:36-37). He was a great teacher to the people, all throughout His ministry He would go into the synagogue and instruct the people. Also, He would teach them with parables that they may know what He was saying, Jesus was very skilled in teaching (Matt. 13)!

Jesus was very balanced; He even taught man how to deal with conflict and even showed righteous anger. If your brother sins against you go to him alone, when the moneychangers were cheating the people of God, He turned over the tables and put them out saying, "My house shall he called the house of prayer; hut ye have made it a den of thieves" (Matt. 21:13). How about knowing when to talk and not? In the face of Pilate He did not respond to their foolishness, but rather waited for the right time to speak saying, "what is truth?" (Jn. 18). At times we must know when to talk and when to be quiet. Lastly, Jesus taught us how to die. Being the oldest of the children, He left Mary to His beloved friend, John. After being unlawfully tried and convicted He was beaten beyond recognition, He hung suspended on the cross between two thieves. We must note that Jesus even though He was hurting bad, still made time to talk with the thief, and because He had power to forgive sin on earth told him, "today you will he with me in paradise" then later He gave up the ghost (Luke 23:43; Mark 2:5)!

So what does Christ look like? I believe it's evident that the scriptures focused more on His mindset, actions and spiritual nature than any physical attribute He may have had. Let us follow His example of suffering, His illustration of love and forgiveness and His pattern of life and we will be assured of eternal life with the Father, Him and the Spirit! *Let God be True!*

## The Hope of Heaven

The apostle Paul told the Ephesians that, for the Christian, there is "one hope of your calling" (Eph. 4:4). However, it seems that many remain confused about what this hope really entails. The Christian's hope lies not in some prominent place in a kingdom upon this earth (Jn 18:36) but in the glorious victory that will allow us to transcend this earth, live beyond this earth's existence, and enjoy eternity in heaven itself (Mt. 25:46). Yet, many aspects of this hope confuse people, including trouble understanding the difference between going to Paradise after death and going straight to heaven. However, these distinctions will become clearer when we focus on God's Word and our hope.


As Paul points out, "we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for?" (Rom. 8:24). Thus, the Christian's hope is not simply salvation from sin today but specifically all that our forgiveness and faithfulness make possible in the future. Therefore, our hope lies beyond this time and this earth to our existence beyond this life. While some might see this as realized at death, the Bible indicates that there is still something yet to come. So, while the faithful Christian can enjoy the peace of Paradise after death, he has still not fulfilled his hope. While death brings separation of the body and the spirit (Jas. 2:26), thus releasing man from the trials associated with the flesh, it does not immediately bring the

Christian the full joy awaiting him. Before this can take place, He must be raised from the dead and given a new, incorruptible body (I Cor. 15:35-50) for this is part of our hope as well (Rom. 8:18-25). This must occur before we see Jesus (1 Jn. 3:2), which will happen only at the end of time (1 Th. 4:13-16) when this earth itself will be burned up (2 Pet. 3:10). At that moment, God will judge all mankind through Jesus Christ (Acts 17:30-31; 2 Cor. 5:10). While those who had died understood their fate because of their own knowledge, at Judgment they will know their fate by divine declaration and action. For the lost this will be painful indeed (Mt. 25:30), but for the saved it will be joy itself (Mt. 25:21, 25). This defining moment of judgment will determine who is with the Lord throughout eternity (1 Th. 4:17) and who will stand outside of the presence or God and His blessings for all eternity (2 Th. 1:7-9). Thus, when the gospel speaks of "eternal life," it is nor just any existence, but a wonderful one, made glorious not by fun things we get to do but by Who is there (Tit. 1:2; 1 Jn. 2:25).

Thus, retaining all of our previous memories of life, but with the perfection and peace of a godly perspective, and existing in a spiritual environment where knowledge is available through divine means, we will know one another and rejoice in perfect fellowship. What can we then do but say with the apostle Peter, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you..." (1 Pet. 1:3-4).

# Search the Scriptures

## Studies for the week of December 18, 2011

# "Asked Not Counsel At The Mouth Of The Lord" (Joshua 9:14)

In the midst of great success, Israel showed a great lack of wisdom that sadly many still make today.

- 1. **Problem**: Not doing what God desired. Israel had been instructed to destroy the cities of Canaan and make no treaties with them (Ex. 34:12-17; Deut. 30:10-18). But they were deceived into making a treaty with the Gibeonites (v1-15).
- 2. **Root of the Problem**: They relied on their own wisdom (v14). We must realize that man needs the wisdom of God (Prov. 14:12; Jer. 10:23) that has been revealed to us (Ps. 119:105; 2 Tim. 3:16). Too often God's wisdom and authority (Col. 3:17) is rejected because of ignorance (Hos. 4:6; Eph. 5:17; 2 Tim. 2:15); relying on our own wisdom (Isa. 55:8-9; 1 Cor. 1:18-19); trusting in others (Matt. 7:15; 15:8-9); and/or apathy (Isa. 30:10; 2 Tim. 4:3-4).
- 3. **Problem Evidenced:** For Israel it was in making this treaty with the Gibeonites; for many today it is seen in not respecting the authority of God (Col. 3:17) in matters of: salvation (Rom. 10:17; Heb. 11:6; Luke 13:3; Rom. 10:9-10; Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:38); organization of the church (Eph. 1:22; Acts 20:28; 1 Tim. 3; 2:9, 12); unity of the church (Eph. 4:4; 1 Cor. 1:10; John 17:21; Rom. 16:16); worship of the church (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16; 1 Cor. 11:23-26; 16:1-2; Matt. 15:9); marriage and the home (Matt. 19:4-6, 9; Eph. 5:22-6:4); moral issues (Phil. 4:8; 1 Thess. 5:21-22; Gal. 5:19-21; 1 Cor. 6:9-10; Rom. 6:4, 6, 13; 12:1-2); etc.

## **Overcoming Discouragement (1 Kings 18)**

Elijah was a great man of God but being a man of life passions (James 5:17) even he would face discouragement in his life. He had just had one of the greatest victories of his life (1 Kings 17) but now he is discouraged and ready to die (18:4). God's lessons in helping Elijah deal with that discouragement can help us in difficult times as well.

- 1. **Rest & Eat (v5-7)** physical care of our bodies should not consume our time/attention (Matt. 4:4; 1 Tim. 4:8) but it is important (Mark 6:31-32, 36-37, 41-42).
- 2. **Be Challenged By The Word of God (v8)** check our thinking by the word of God; why do we feel this way? what is really the problem; have we prayed about it? Can we do anything about it? what good can come of this? (Ps. 42:10-11; Gen. 3:9; Phil. 4:6-7; James 1:2-4).
- 3. **Remember The God You Serve (v11-12)** He is the same God at all times who will not leave us (Heb. 13:5-6; Ps. 23:4; 2 Cor. 1:3, 10).
- 4. **Go To Work** (**v15-17**) Having rested and refocused, Elijah needed to get back to work; sitting around would not help (2 Cor. 1:4; 1 Cor. 15:58; Gal. 6:9; 2 Thess. 3:13)
- 5. **Remember You Are Not Alone (v18)** There were others enduring faithfully; we are not alone in the things we face (1 Cor. 10:13; 1 Pet. 5:8-9; Heb. 12:1-4).
- 6. **Get Some Help (v19-21)** You don't have to face life's problems alone (Gal. 6:2; 1 Thess. 5:14; 4:18; John 5:12; Heb. 10:24-25).
