The Most Important Things To Teach Your Children

She was pregnant and expecting her first child. Like all mothers, she was concerned about what others might think, but there was no way she could not be excited about what was about to happen. Then it hit her. This gift from God was His, and she and Joseph were only caretakers with the responsibility to train up the child so this gift could be given back to God.

What do you teach that child? What values do you give to prepare the child for the trials which lie ahead? What expectant mother has not had these thoughts? As you think about these matters, consider that these same responsibilities were faced by Mary the mother of Jesus. Read Matthew 4 to see what Mary taught Jesus as she trained Him in the way He should go.

A **child must be taught the meaning of life.** When Satan appealed to Jesus to live by the rule of self-gratification, to fulfill the lust of the flesh, and to make that the dominate force which controlled His life, He was ready! He had learned one important truth in His upbringing: "Man shall not live by bread alone." If one lives by the rule of self-gratification, he misses life. The only way for man to live is to understand that every word which God speaks gives life!

A **child must be taught that God is more important than material things.** The Lord was offered all the treasures of this world, but He turned them down. Those who had trained Him for life put in His heart that only God is to be worshipped. "Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve." Look at the two verbs — *worship* and *serve*. They cover not just formal times of adoring God, but aspects of daily living. When one craves material things, they become his lord and he becomes subservient to them. A child must know that materialism cannot become a master!

A **child must be taught about the nature of God.** Satan's misuse of the Bible did not confuse Jesus for a moment, for He knew God. He had not just been taught the Word of God, He had been taught the nature of God. He did not just know about God, He knew God!

Let me encourage all young mothers and fathers (the same could apply to "expectant" grandmothers and grandfathers). Look at the child of yours as Mary looked at the child God gave to her. He was simply a gift from heaven, loaned and entrusted to her for a short time, with the grave responsibility to prepare the child for the next time the child would see God. Prepare your child! Teach him the Bible. Teach him about life, about "things," and about Him.

A Cappella

Church, music. Without accompaniment. That's a capella. A *cappella* comes from the Latin, *ad*, to according to, and *capella*, chapel. A cappella is the style of church chapel music.

But the term a *cappella* could hardly be applied to the music heard in most churches today. That which used to be the only means of praising God in church (a cappella) is seldom seen in most houses of worship.

When Everett Ferguson was doing his graduate study at Harvard, he lived in the same dormitory with a Greek Orthodox student who was a graduate of the University of Athens and a candidate for an advanced degree at Harvard. Everett asked him if it was correct that the Greek Orthodox churches did not use instrumental music in their public worship. He said, "Yes." When asked the reasons why, he replied: "We do not use instrumental music because it is not in the New Testament and it is contrary to the nature of Christian worship."

Under the Old Testament, instruments of music certainly had a part in the worship of God. But when we come to the New Testament they are not mentioned. The nature of Christian worship is spiritual. Thus even those who had formerly used the instrument failed to adopt it in primitive Christian worship. In fact, the general introduction of instrumental music can certainly not be assigned to a date earlier than the fifth and sixth centuries. Even Gregory the Great, who toward the end of the sixth century added greatly to the existing church music, absolutely prohibited the use of instruments.

Chrysostom gives us a picture of what Christian worship was like up to the fifth century. "It was the ancient custom, as it still is with us, for all to come together, and unitedly to join in singing. The young and the old, rich and poor, male and female, bond and free, all join in one song . . All worldly distinctions here cease, and the whole congregation forms one general chorus."

In the words of the apostle Paul, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him" (Colossians 3:16-17).

Paul Harvey, much-beloved radio personality, once quipped, "Vegetarian is an old Indian word for 'doesn't hunt well."

What about us? How well do we hunt (2 Timothy 2.15)? Are we Bible vegetarians?

If we are searching the Scriptures as we should, there will be plenty of meat in our diets. In fact, there might even be some strong meat or squirrel (Hebrews 5:12-14). Don't knock it until you have tried it! It tastes kind of like chicken.

Seven Walks Of Ephesians

Walk denotes activity; more than that, it denotes continuous activity. In Paul's letter to the Ephesians, the figurative use of walking for living or carrying on our life is employed seven times. How very important and impressive is the lesson.



- ◆ Walking in disobedience: "And you hath e quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins; wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience" (2:1-2)
- ♦ Walking worthily: "I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (4:1-3).
- Walking in vanity: "This I say therefore, and testify in the Lord, that ye henceforth walk not as other Gentiles walk, in the vanity of their mind" (4:17)
- Walking in love: "And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet smelling savour" (5:2).
- Walking as children of light:"Now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light" (5:8).
- Walking in wisdom: "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil" (5:15-16).

Studies for the week of January 15, 2012

Emmanuel, God With Us (Matt. 1-4)

Matthew presents in these opening chapters the Christ, the One who had been anticipated that was now come and presents reasons why He should be listened to and followed.

- **1. Fulfiller of Prophecy** From His lineage, His birth, His life, and His death Jesus was exactly who the prophets foretold of and who men should have been looking for.
 - a. Matthew shows Jesus legal right as the son of David (Matt. 1:1-17) and mentions often prophecies fulfilled (1:22-23; 2:1, 5-6; 15, 17-18; 23; 3:3; 4:13-16).
 - b. The apostles would point back on these events as proof that Jesus is the Christ (Luke 24:25-27, 44; Acts 17:2, 3)
- **2. Doer of God's Will** All the accounts of Jesus remind us of a central desire in His life to please His Father.
 - a. Both His baptism (3:13-17) and His temptations (4:1-11) show a desire to please His Father and do His will.
 - b. Others highlight this desire as well (John 4:34; 8:29)
- 3. Fisher of Men Likewise Jesus shows His purpose in life of drawing men to Himself, the One we need to hear and follow, the One who would save us from our sins.
 - a. His was come to save men from their sins (1:21), now He begins preaching, teaching, and working miracles (4:17, 23-24) in the presence of the people (4:25) and His disciples who will carry on this work (4:18-22).
 - b. All this showed His interest in people (Matt. 9:36) and the desire to fulfill His Work (Luke 19:10; John 12:32).

Thus Matthew sets the stage to present Jesus' teaching/work...

O For A Faith That Will Not Shrink

The result of exercising our spiritual senses unto discernment (cf. Heb. 5:14) should be spiritual growth/maturity that will be seen in our faith, a faith that will not shrink but rather is one that is pleasing to God. As the song we will consider indicates such is a faith that:

- 1. Will Stand (rather than shrink in face of opposition or persecution)
 - a. One can know he will face some persecution in the Christian life (2 Tim. 3:12; Matt. 5:10-12)
 - b. Question is, what will we do in that situation? (Matt. 13:20-23; Heb. 10:38-39; 1 Pet. 5:8-9; James 5:10-11; Heb. 11:36-12:4).
- 2. Will Grow (rather than complain, it will learn to trust God and accept discipline)
 - a. Likewise the Christian can expect some correction/discipline in life (2 Tim. 3:16-17; Heb. 12:5-11).
 - b. Again, we have to choose what to do with it (Prov. 12:1; 15:32; 2 Cor. 1:3-4, 8-10; James 1:2-4).
- **3. Will Shine** (rather than doubt or fear, it will be an example to others)
 - a. Doubt and fear will cause us to draw back, be silent; faith ought to drive us to stand out (Ps. 118:6; Heb. 13:6; Matt. 10:26-39).
 - b. Stand out in the way we live and evangelism (Matt. 5:16; Phil. 2:15-16; Matt. 28:18-20; Acts 8:4; 2 Tim. 4:2; 1 Pet. 3:13-15).
- **4. Will Hope** (regardless of what may come, we will trust in God and look forward with expectation to our eternal home).
 - a. Regardless of what it meant enduring Paul trusted God and walked with Him (2 Tim. 1:12, 4:6-8; Rom. 8:18).
 - b. Such a one has confidence in God and His promises now and in eternity (Jn 10:10; Mk 10:29-30; Jms 1:12; Rev 2:10; 1 Jn 5:13)
