Servants vs. Volunteers

Volunteers usually serve with less commitment than servants. They often need to fit their volunteer hours around other priorities in their lives. Volunteers generally view their work as a "gift" to the organization. Rarely do they not feel that appreciation is due them, after all, they have given all their time instead of being compensated. Volunteers usually have lower expectations placed on them, because they are free to go at anytime. And if you listen to their reasoning on why they give their time, it is often because it makes them "feel good about themselves." Notice, God doesn't call us to volunteer, but to serve. Consider that servants are committed--totally committed. "By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down our lives for the brethren" (1 John 3:16).

Servants don't just place God first on the list, then follow with number 2, 3, 4 and so on. Servants make sure God is first in all areas of their life! God is first. Then He is first in the 2nd area, He is first in the 3rd area and so on. "And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ" (Colossians 3:23-24).

Servants do not see their work as a gift that deserves gratitude, but instead they understand it is their duty. "Does he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I think not. So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do" (Luke 17:9-10).

Instead of expecting appreciation, servants are thankful for the opportunity recognizing it as a part of God's grace. That is correct, the opportunity to serve God is a gracious opportunity we don't deserve. Paul understood it when he said, "And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord who has enabled me, because He counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry" (1 Timothy 1:12).

A servant's service isn't motivated by self promotion or glory. A servant's service is accomplished through obedience to the Master who knows our purpose and has work for us to do. "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope. Then you will call upon Me and go and pray to Me, and I will listen to you. And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart" (Jeremiah 29:11-13).

Don't Volunteer, Serve! It is Your Duty!

10 REASONS WHY CHRISTIANS OUGHT TO REJOICE

Christians are not exempt from difficulties and problems in life, moments of sorrow, or disappointments. Yet, God wants us to be people of joy. "Joy" is defined as "a very glad feeling; happiness." In our service to Jesus the Christ, despite having to face occasions in this earthly life that are not what we would call pleasant, there is reason to have joy! Let us take a few moments to reflect on just why all followers of the Christ ought to be filled with joy or rejoicing. All Christians should rejoice because:

- 2. The Lord wants us to. "Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say, rejoice" (Philippians 4:4).
- 3. We have salvation in Jesus. That famous eunuch from Ethiopia "went on his way rejoicing" because he had his sins washed away when he was baptized into Christ (Acts 8:39). The jailer in Philippi did the same (Acts 16:34). Nothing in life should bring greater joy than our salvation in Christ!
- 4. Our names are written in heaven. When seventy of Jesus' disciples returned to Him "with.joy" because they had cast out demons in our Lord's name, Jesus told them, "Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20).
- 5. We have the word of God to exhort, comfort, and save us. "I rejoice at thy word, as one that findeth great spoil" (Psalm 119:162). "And these things write we unto you, that your joy may be full" (1 John 1:4).
- 6. Trials strengthen us and help us develop patience. "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience" (James 1:2, 3).

- 7. We are privileged to suffer for Jesus. "Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations" (1 Peter 1:6). "But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings." (1 Peter 4:13).
- 8. We preach the gospel and see souls being saved as a result. "They that sow in tears shall reap in joy. He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him" (Psalm 126:5,6). "Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest. And he that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal; that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together" (John 4:35,36).
- 9. We see other members of the church living faithfully to Christ. "I rejoiced greatly that I found of thy children walking in truth, as we have received a commandment from the Father" (2 John 4). "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth" (3 John 4).
- 10. We see that other saints have joy in their lives.

 "Rejoice with them that do rejoice" (Romans 12:15).

 "The members should have the same care one for another. And whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it; or one member be honoured, all the members rejoice with it" (1 Corinthians 12:25,26).
- 11. We have the privilege to contribute to and be a part of the Lord's body and His work. "Moreover, brethren, we do you to wit of the grace of God bestowed on the churches of Macedonia; How that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded unto the riches of their liberality" (2 Corinthians 8:1, 2).

Studies for the week of January 22, 2012

Abraham, A Friend of God (Part 1 of 2)

Abraham was called a friend of God (James 2:23); what can we learn from him and try to imitate?

1. He Was Obedient

- a. Ready to follow God and His will (Gen. 12:4; Heb. 11:8).
- b. Promptly (Heb. 11:8; Gen. 22:3; cf. Acts 2:37-38, 41; 16:32-33; 26:19, 22:16, 9:20).
- c. Humbly (he submitted to God's will; Gen. 18:27).
- d. In faith & trust (Heb. 11:8, 9, 13-18; Rom. 4:18-22; cf. Acts 27:25; 2 Tim. 1:12).
- e. No wonder God placed confidence in him (Gen. 18:19).

2. He Overcame Obstacles

- a. Sin/Deficency of Faith Gen. 12 tells of a great famine (v10) in which Abraham fled to Egypt and told Sarah to lie about their relationship (v12) which led to Pharaoh righly rebuking him (v18-20). But Abraham returned to worship God (Gen. 13:3-4; cf. 1 John 1:7, 9).
- b. Strife he sought peace with Lot and their herdsman by offering Lot to choose where he would like to go and Abraham would go the other way (Gen. 13:8-9). He again showed humility in so doing but also a desire for peace (cf. Matt. 5:9; Rom. 12:18, 10).
- c. Dangers & Temptations Willing to defend Lot and others at personal cost and risk (Gen. 14:14; Phil. 2:3-4); but also not overcome with the desire for possessions (Gen. 14:23; cf. James 1:17; Matt. 13:22; 1 Tim. 6:9-10). May we learn from Abraham and "...walk in the steps

of that faith of our father Abraham..." (Rom. 4:12)

The Heart of Paul

Looking at Paul's heart (his emotion) one can see what he treasured (cf. Matt. 6:21)—he loved others, especially his brethren in Christ, loved the truth, and loved God and such is evident by his tears.

- **1. He Cried Over The Spiritual Condition Of Others** (Rom. 9:1-3; 10:1). He desired and longed for the salvation of others. Do we feel the same towards others that are lost? Do we share the same urgency (Rom. 1:15-16; 1 Tim. 1:12; 2 Tim. 2:4; 2 Pet. 3:9)?
- **2. He Cried When He Rebuked Others** (2 Cor. 2:4). He did not take joy in such; his letters were an expression of his love (2 Cor. 7:3, 7-10, 12). Does our love show (Eph. 4:15; Prov. 27:5-6)?
- **3. He Cried When He Preached** (Acts 20:30-31). His example shows he was a faithful watchman (Eze. 33:6-7), he was impartial (1 Tim. 5:21), he was constant and untiring (Eze. 3:17-21), and he was compassionate (Eze. 3:15). Are we emotionally involved?
- **4.** He Cried When He Thought Of Enemies Of The Cross (Phil. 3:8; Acts 20:19). Paul's enemies were those that stood opposed to the truth: they destroyed themselves and others who heard and followed them. Yet his prayer was not for retribution or comfort, but for the cause of Christ (Eph. 6:18-20; Col. 4:3-4; 2 Thess 3:1-2). Does error/opposition bring us to tears?
- 5. He Cried When He Thought Of The Hardships Of Others (Rom. 12:15; 2 Tim. 1:4). Paul's care for individuals and congregations is evident in his writings; he did not belittle the problems of others in light of his own but rather put them first (2 Cor. 11:23-28); he was merciful/sympathetic (Matt. 5:7) and like Christ had a tender heart (Phil. 2:4-8). Do we care for others?
