The Beauty Of It All

Sometimes I wonder what God thinks of His people. We are so abundantly blessed that we cannot get around it all. We live in the greatest country in the world, with the most blessed freedom, and still we bemoan the fact that we don't have everything we want. We, for the most part, forsake the simple beauty of the life God has given us. We are "fearfully and wonderfully made..." (Ps. 139:14) and most of us cannot see. We live in the country of the "fruited plain" and yet do not regard it as anything special. When we are blessed with health we take it for granted, as if it were owed to us. When we get sick, we get in a depressed state and demand to know why. Perhaps we need to go back to the basics of His teaching and understand the beauty of it all.

"The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament showeth his handywork" (Ps. 19:1). How fortunate most of us are to be blessed with eyes that can see; the beauty of a thunderstorm, the magnificence of a bolt of lightening, the sun gleaming through the darkened clouds that are full of rain. How blessed we are to be able to stand out in the open to view the glory of the stars that glitter the sky at night, the moon that makes even babies take notice with its celestial beams, and the planets that blend in so well we cannot identify them all. "O Lord, our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth! Who hast set thy glory above the heavens. Out of the mouths of babes and suckling's hast thou ordained strength because of thine enemies, that thou mightest still the enemy and the avenger. When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars which thou hast ordained; What is man, that thou are mindful of him? And the son of man, that thou visitest him?" (Ps. 8:1-4).

When the Lord blesses us with glory to behold, we often refer to it as ugly and dangerous, but even the rattlesnake is beautiful in its own way. When we struggle with any part of life, we refuse to see the beauty of it all. How many different colors of horses did He make? What about the cattle, and the beasts of the field? How many different creatures did He make for us to admire, and over the which we have dominion? Why should it be then, that we cannot enjoy the life and the person that God has made in His own image, after all He is here with us? "Whither shall I go from thy spirit? Or wither shall I flee from thy presence? If I ascend up into the heaven, thou are there: if I make my bed in Sheol, behold, thou are there, If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea; Even there shall thy hand lead me, and thy right hand shall hold me. 3 Reasons Young Americans Shouldn't Give Up On God

Perhaps you saw the news story out last Thursday that reported that young Americans are giving up on the concept of God:

"Young Americans are drifting away from God, according to a new Pew Research Center poll. Only 67 percent of Americans under 30 say they 'never doubt the existence of God.' That's down from 76 percent in 2009 and 83 percent in 2007 – a 15 percent point drop in just five years."

While the survey did not include any potential reasons as to why this generation is abandoning God the story offered three theories. (1) Fundamentalists are turning off some young people, (2) atheists and agnostic role models are getting more vocal, and (3) liberal attacks on religion are to blame. I cannot leave the impression that such a report does not bother me. Any time there is an indication that people are losing their faith it has to be troubling. However, the reality is that while these are possible reasons that people are giving up on God they are not good reasons to give up on God. In fact they are themselves better reasons to strengthen our faith. Let's put these theories into proper perspective and notice three reasons young Americans shouldn't give up on God:

1. Christianity is fundamental. The word fundamental has almost become a curse word in today's society. But for something to be fundamental demands that there is a standard expectation. The problem we face as a society is not law itself it is man's reaction to law. The story states that we are "evolving toward greater acceptance of divorce, premarital sex, women's equality, and gay rights." Society may be evolving but truth is standard. With society you never know where you are heading but with God you always know what you get (Hebrews 13:8).

- 2. Skeptics are getting more vocal, thus so should we. This has been a problem the church has been facing for decades. It is not that more and more people are turning to atheism. The atheistic crowd actually makes up an extremely small portion of our populace. The problem is that they are just getting louder than those who believe. We're not outnumbered we are just out voiced. Christians need to be too stubborn to be outworked by the devil's army (Jude 3). I am encouraged to see an upswing in evangelistic activity among the church's younger generation so hopefully this point is already in action.
- 3. The attacks on Christianity are liberal. I have never understood the liberal concept either politically or religiously. The liberal mindset wants to loosen the stringencies of law. Social liberals despise the laws of the land and actively seek to skirt them. Spiritual liberals despise God's law. The problem is that God's law cannot be logically defeated so the only option they have is to attack it. We should be for anything the devil hates. It's obvious from his servants that Satan hates Christianity and God so we should be for them at all costs and actively give an answer for our faith (1 Peter 3:15).

While the news story cited only lists these three theories there are many, many more reasons we should step up our efforts to exalt God. He is the only hope we have for our lives and for our world. Let's not give up on Him!

Search the Scriptures

Studies for the week of June 24, 2012

Gathered To His People (Numbers 31:2)

This is an express of hope and comfort that is spoken concerning many of God's faithful, but what does it indicate?

- 1. **Separate From Physical Death**—Yes, this indicated that Moses would die but that phrase is used in addition to death (Gen. 25:7-8; 35:29; 49:33). One died and then was gathered to their people, a reminder that the soul lives on after the body dies (James 2:26).
- 2. **Separate From Burial**—Yes, Moses would be buried too; but still more was indicated. Many propose this simply means one is buried with their ancestors, yet a number of instances show a distinction between being buried with ancestors and gathered to their people (Gen. 15:15; 25:8-10; 49:33; 50:13; 35:29); Moses and Aaron are both examples in that neither was buried with ancestors and yet they are said to be gathered to their people (Num. 20:23-26; Deut. 32:48-50; 34:6).
- 3. Indicates An Eternal Home Of The Soul What we are reminded of is that the soul is not destroyed at death, it lives and on would be united with those who had gone before. These believed they had an eternal, heavenly home (Heb. 11:16); an understanding shared by others (Eccl. 12:7; 2 Sam. 12:22-23). This is confirmed by Jesus teaching that, though dead, these men lived on (Matt. 22:31-32; 8:11). This was an expression that would give them home and comfort, and can do the same for us today as we realize we have a home we can anticipate with God and the faithful (John 14:1-3; 2 Cor. 5:1; Rev. 14:13; 1 Thess. 4:13-18).

Letter to Thyatira (Revelation 2:18-29)

A church should maintain moral purity.

This was a wealthy city in which Christians may have been tempted to compromise their faith to succeed in business...all are reminded that God knows their actions and their hearts; in the end they are exhorted to remain faithful.

- 1) God Knows Our Character (v18-19) Regardless of whether others took note or praised their character, God knew what manner of people they were (Matt. 5:16; Phil. 2:14-16; 1 Pet. 2:9).
- 2) God Knows The Troublers Of His People (v20) They should have silenced the false teachers that led others astray (Eph. 5:11; 1 Cor. 5:6; Matt. 12:30); possibly some woman had led others astray into compromise and immorality as Jezebel of old (1 Kings 21:25; 2 Kings 9:22).
- **3) God's Longsuffering Will End** (v21-23) Time had been given to repent, but she refused; time for patience was over (1 Tim. 2:4; Gal. 6:7-8). There comes a time when God can no longer allow wickedness to continue.
- **4) God Will Reward His People** (v24-29) God knows each individual and will reward accordingly (Heb. 4:12-13; 2 Cor. 5:10; 1 Cor. 4:5); the Christians are urged to remain faithful to the end and gain the victory (1 Cor. 15:58; 2 Thess. 1:4-10; Rev. 2:10).
