The Purpose of Gospel Preaching By Clay Bond

"O earth, earth, hear the word of the LORD" (Jer. 22:29).

These words, spoken so long ago, reflect what God wants more than anything. His desire is for His creation to hear His spoken word which is "quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart" (Heb. 4:12). In our age, God has designated Gospel preaching to be the means by which His word is proclaimed to all the earth (Titus 1:3).

There are several implied purposes in Gospel preaching, one of which is clearly seen in Acts chapter eighteen. When Paul came into the debauched city of Corinth, he preached the Gospel which entailed the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ (1 Cor. 15:1-4). Paul proclaimed the power of God's word to those who were living in sin and called upon them to submit to its transforming power (1 Cor. 6:9-11). Many of the Corinthians who heard the Gospel on this occasion *"believed, and were baptized"* (Acts 18:8). They were washed, sanctified and justified in the name of Jesus Christ (1 Cor. 6:11). Therefore, we see that one primary purpose of Gospel preaching is to convert sinners (Psa. 19:7).

God has no desire for anybody to be lost; His desire is that all would come to repentance (2 Pet. 3:9; Acts 17:30). Jesus once warned, "*Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish*" (Luke 13:3). It is through repentance that we come to the "acknowledging of the truth" that sets us free from Satan's captivity (2 Tim. 2:25-26). In Paul's letters to Timothy, knowledge and repentance are linked with salvation (1 Tim. 2:4; 2 Tim. 2:25). Both of these elements come through Gospel preaching. Gospel preaching is designed to bring about repentance.

God, who desires for "all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim. 2:4), has designed Gospel preaching to save souls from eternal damnation through knowledge. By hearing the Gospel preached, the lost can come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ (Rom. 10:14). The truth that can set us free from the bondage of sin is made known through Gospel preaching (John 8:32). Bringing men to the knowledge of truth is, therefore, another purpose of Gospel preaching.

While converting sinners is an important purpose of Gospel preaching, equally important is the edification of the saints. When Paul left Timothy at Ephe-(Continued on page 4)

THE CHRUCH by Bill Burk

I already know what you are thinking. You are thinking that the preacher made a typo in the heading. He was not paying enough attention to catch the mistake. You are thinking that the title of the article should be the "Church." Maybe it should, but then again maybe not. I have some good reasons why I am not planning on changing it.

1. First, although it is not quite the same as the original, it is close. You have to admit that "chruch" looks a great deal like "church." The two words possess exactly the same letters both in type and number. If you just give it a quick glance you would probably never tell the difference. Why change it?

2. Second, accuracy in spelling cannot be as important as sincerity of attitude. Anytime I type a heading for an article I sincerely desire to do it in the right way. So what if I miss it on occasion or even every time? What difference does it make anyway? Are you telling me that because the word is misspelled that I am wrong and then I have missed the boat? You have to be kidding me.

3. Third, I do not believe that there is only one way to spell the word. Please, I do not want to see the dictionary and no, I do not care to look at the spell check on my word processor. I know what those will tell me. There are too many people out there spelling it differently. I refuse to believe, no matter what the dictionary says, that all of them are wrong. To think so would be naïve and narrow-minded.

4. Fourth, just give me the meaning, I do not want the spelling. As long as I know what I am talking about I do not need to spell it properly. Stop telling me that I cannot have the definition unless I properly represent the word it is supposed to define. It is not the word that mat-

ters but the meaning behind it. Stop being so legalistic!

5. Fifth, I believe that, in actuality, all the letters of the alphabet are in the word "church." You can spell the word however you want. It does not matter. Who are we to judge what letters are in "church" and which ones are not? If I want to spell "church" "axwtre" then who's to say I am wrong?

Once again, I know what you are thinking. You are thinking that those are the most ridiculous arguments imaginable for spelling the word "church" in any other way that the way it is supposed to be spelled. True, the arguments are ridiculous. Yet, don't people make the same type of arguments regarding their understanding of the Biblical concept of the church? Some argue that the organizations of men (Matthew 15:9, 13) are not too different than the Lord's church. Yet, when compared with Scripture, there is no comparison (Matthew 16:13-18; Acts 2:1-47).

Others claim sincerity is all that matters in order to please God. True, sincerity is a must if God is to be pleased (Romans 6:17; 1 Timothy 1:5, 18-20). Yet, it is not the only thing that matters (Acts 23:1; 1 Timothy 1:13-15). Sincerity must be coupled with truth (John 4:24; 8:32; 17:17).

Some argue that God accepts many religious bodies. Yet, the Bible teaches that there is only one body (Ephesians 4:4) which is the church (Colossians 1:16-18). There is only one way for salvation to be enjoyed (John 14:6) and that is in the one body of Jesus (Ephesians 1:22 -23).

Then there are those who say just give me Jesus but not the church. You cannot have the head without the (Continued on page 4)

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sus to build up the saints in the most holy faith, he exhorted him to "*Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine*" (2 Tim. 4:2). In order to develop Christian character, those who are converted out of darkness need to hear Gospel preaching (2 Pet. 1:5-8). Paul said, "*So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God*" (Rom. 10:17). Gospel preaching feeds our faith and helps us to grow in faith (2 Pet. 3:18; Col. 1:9-11)! Even the most mature of Christians needs to be built up and prepared to overcome temptation (Acts 20:32; 1 Cor. 10:13; James 1:13-14). Through Gospel preaching the Christian learns to deny ungodliness and worldly lust and "*live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world*" (Titus 2:12).

In Mark 16:15 we read Jesus' marching orders to His church, "Go ye *into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature.*" When we preach the preaching that God bids us, we can trust that His Word will not return unto Him void. Gospel preaching will accomplish its intended purposes (Jonah 3:2; Isa. 55:11). It will convert sinners through the knowledge of God; it will bring the erring to repentance; it will edify God's children.

The word of God has the ability to reach into the innermost depths of our being and transform who and what we are. When the Gospel is preached and when it is properly heeded and applied, it produces abundant life (John 10:10). Truly the Gospel is a treasure that has been given to us (2 Cor. 4:7). Thank God for Gospel preaching and may each and every Christian share in Paul's sentiment, *"Woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel!"* (1 Cor. 9:16).

body (Colossians 1:16ff.). They want the Man but not His plan. The Bible doesn't teach such a notion.

Finally, there are those that think that every person who claims loyalty to Jesus is in the universal church. In other words, all the denominations make up the one church of Christ. However, we must ask where the Bible teaches such a thing. In order for that to be correct, we would have to find all the varying denominations mentioned in the New Testament as making up the New Testament church. Sadly, the idea is just not there.

When writing an article, it does matter how you spell "church." And, when considering one's relationship with God, it does make a difference as to whether he belongs to the "church of Christ" or merely a "church" founded in the minds of men. Are you a member of the Church (Acts 2:38)?
