COLLATERAL DAMAGE By Terry Jackson

The word collateral means to accompany as secondary. For example, a bomb may explode in a car. Collateral damage is the damage that is sustained by those things around the car. Religion has been fed a steady diet of pop-culture that has resulted in a pseudo faith. Many churches adopt the gurus of feel-good-ism to lead them out of the supposed desert of ignorance and prejudice and into the promise land of intellectualism and acceptance. Preachers have been replaced with storytellers, and sermons contain a "mushy" doctrine. As a distressing result, our kids have become the collateral damage of all of this pop culture pseudo faith. Dale Buss of the Wall Street Journal writes that the "mushy doctrine has gotten to them [teens] in a big way." He then quotes statistics from a Barna Research pole with surprising results.

Of the teens surveyed:

88% called themselves Christians
60% believe the Bible is totally accurate
56% feel religion is very important to their life
Over 50 % believed Jesus committed sins while on the earth
60% agreed that good works ALONE will earn them a place in heaven
2/3 believe that Satan is only a symbol
6% believe in moral absolutes

Only 9% of those born again believed that moral truth is absolute

What are we doing to our children? Some may say, "I never taught my kids any of that stuff." The real question is "What have I taught my kids?" People send them to Bible classes and expect their teachers to teach them everything they need to know in a couple of forty-five minute classes a week. We put the faith of our children in the hands of Bible teachers and trust that the time they have will be enough to fortify the spiritual stamina of our kids. They then leave home and are bombarded with the disbelief that has become the trade-mark of modern religion. What lessons have modern religion taught? (1) You can believe anything or nothing and call it faith. (2) The Bible is not recognized as God's authority. (3) Truth is a matter of personal perception. (4) There are no moral absolutes. This same ignorance that destroys God's people will collaterally destroy their children (**Hosea 4:6**).

Deut. 6:1-7 "Now this is the commandment, the statutes, and the judgments which the LORD your God has commanded me to teach you, that you might do them in the land where you are going over to possess it, so that you and your son and your grandson might fear the LORD your God, to keep all His statutes and His commandments, which I command you, all the days of your life, and that your days may be prolonged. O Israel, you should listen and be careful to do it, that it may be well with you and that you may multiply greatly, just as the LORD, the God of your fathers, has prom-ised you, in a land flowing with milk and honey. Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD is one! And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words, which I am commanding you today, shall be on your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your sons and shall talk of them when you sit in your house and when you walk by the way and when you lie down and when you rise up."



But it shall not be so among you: but whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister; And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant: Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.

A REAL MAN

If you were to ask the average man on the street what it takes to be a real man - you would probably get as many different answers as people you asked. Some might say that a real man is one who portrays the "Rambo" image. Others might say that a real man is one who is physical and dominating in appearance and demeanor. And, not a few, would say real manhood is simply found in putting away childish things - acting like an adult.

Concerning being a real man, David, the great king and mighty warrior in Israel, had a much different view. "Now the days of David drew near that he should die, and he charged Solomon his son, saying: 'I go the way of all the earth; be strong, therefore, and prove yourself a man. And keep the charge of the LORD your God: to walk in His ways, to keep His statutes, His commandments, His judgments, and His testimonies, as it is written in the Law of Moses, that you may prosper in all that you do and wherever you turn'" (1 Kgs. 2:1-3). David, on his death bed, is encouraging his son, Solomon, to act like a man - a real man.

A real man will "keep the charge of the Lord." The word "keep" comes from a Hebrew word meaning to guard, protect, to attend to. Thus, a real man is concerned about truth and will stand up for it. It should be surprising that this mentality is often taught in the New Testament.

Jude proclaimed that we should "contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints" (*Jude 3*). Paul said, "Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses" (*1 Tim. 6:12*). It takes a real man to oppose that which false and promote that which is right.

A real man will "walk in His ways," that is, a real (Continued on page 3)

man will walk in the ways of God—not in his own ways. A real man will remember that "There is a way that seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death" (*Pro. 14:12*). A real man will travel the narrow way. "Enter by the narrow gate; for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and there are many who go in by it. Be-cause narrow is the gate and difficult is the way which leads to life, and there are few who find it" (*Mt. 7:13-14*).

David said that a real man will observe God's statutes, commandments, judgments and testimonies. It is impossible to draw fine distinctions between these terms but by piling up these synonyms for God's law, David was making it clear that all God's law must be observed. By walking in the ways of the Lord, Solomon would prosper or succeed as a real man. Obedience to the Lord was the condition for experiencing a rich and full life. Real men will be obedient to the will of God. God's instruction to Joshua was, "Only be strong and very courageous, that you may observe to do according to all the law which Moses My servant commanded you; do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, that you may prosper wherever you go" (*Jos. 1:7*).

It takes genuine courage and real manhood to withstand worldly pressures and faithfully follow the will of God! Are you a real man?
