The Voice of the Lord

Jeremiah, spokesman of God, said, "They shall not deliver thee. Obey, I beseech thee, the voice of Jehovah, in that which I speak unto thee: so it shall be well with thee, and thy soul shall live" (Jer. 38:20).

Many people are convinced that God speaks directly to them as He did to fathers, prophets, and people during the Patriarchal, Mosaical, and miraculous age of the early church. I recall attending a funeral where an apostate preacher who claimed to be a member of the Lord's church said: "I was driving home when I learned of the tragic accident. I had no idea what I was going to say or do and God spoke to me before I reached home, saying, "I'll tell you what to say and what to do." I am sure that some attending that funeral service **believed** what the apostate said — but I surely did not. I have been attempting to preach the gospel for 48 years and have conducted many funeral services, but I have not had God speak directly to me a single time. This man who made such a claim was a liar because the apostle Peter said, "Of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons..." (Acts 10:34). God reveals Himself today to **all** in the same way — through His inspired Word!

"The voice of Jehovah" in Jeremiah 38:20 stands for **the word of God.** God speaks to people today through His Son (Heb. 1:1-2). His Son speaks to us through the apostles and inspired writers who recorded His words (John 16:13; 1 Cor. 2:13). Let us now profit by studying the Word of the Lord. It is:

A Warning Voice! "Thus saith Jehovah, This city shall surely be given into the hand of the army of the king of Babylon, and he shall take it. Then the princes said unto the king, Let this man, we pray thee, be put to death; forasmuch as he weakeneth the hands of the men of war that remain in this city, and the hands of all the people, in speaking such words unto them: for this man seeketh not the welfare of this people, but the hurt" (Jer. 38:3-4).

One definition of warning is "a threat or a sign that something bad is going to happen." Another definition is "a piece of advice given to somebody to be careful or to stop doing something" (Encarta Dictionary). Is it not wonderful that God desires for us to be careful and safe as we journey through this life? Is it not because of His love that God warns us of all that is hurtful to our life and soul? A warning is not bad if one's house is on fire, if a bridge has collapsed on a fogy night, if water is several feet over a highway, or if a bear is on the prowl. Could it

be that most people think more of their physical life than they do of their spiritual life? God wants us to go to Heaven, so He warns us that continuing to practice sin will cost us our soul (1 Cor. 6:9-11; Gal. 5:19-21; Rom. 6:23).

A Humbling Voice! "Thus saith Jehovah, He that abideth in this city shall die by the sword, by the famine, and by the pestilence; but he that goeth forth to the Chaldeans shall live, and his life shall be unto him for a prey, and he shall live" (Jer. 38:2).

There are times when pride must be swallowed, and the action that is taken is less than desirable. Sin has a way of humbling people, and those who refused Chaldean captivity would die. Had it not been for sin and disobedience God's people would have been spared captivity by the cruel Babylonians. Such an incident clearly shows the high cost of sin and foolish pride!

A Hated Voice! "Then the princes said unto the king, Let this man, we pray thee, be put to death; forasmuch as he weakeneth the hands of the men of war that remain in this city, and the hands of all the people, in speaking such words unto them: for this man seeketh not the welfare of this people, but the hurt. And Zedekiah the king said, Behold, he is in your hand; for the king is not he that can do anything against you. Then took they Jeremiah, and cast him into the dungeon of Malchijah the king's son, that was in the court of the guard: and they let down Jeremiah with cords. And in the dungeon there was no water, but mire; and Jeremiah sank in the mire" (Jer. 38:4-6).

Even thought the words were from the mouth of God, the people did not want to hear them from the prophet. Nothing has changed today! Let a gospel preacher preach against sin and warn against hell and

brethren want to dispense with the preacher. They get to where they hate his presence and hate his voice. It is as the Lord said, "If the world hateth you, ye know that it hath hated me before it hated you. If ye were of the world, the world would love its own: but because ye are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hateth you" (John 15:18-19).

An Assuring Voice! "But Jeremiah said, They shall not deliver thee. Obey, I beseech thee, the voice of Jehovah, in that which I speak unto thee: so it shall be well with thee, and thy soul shall live" (Jer. 38:20).

Zedekiah was afraid for his life and ask Jeremiah to hide nothing from him. Jeremiah assures Zedekiah that if he surrenders to the Babyonians he will live and the city will not be burned. God has always sought to assure mankind through His Word. More often than not, however, men have chosen to reject the blessed assurance they could have had!

An Infallible Voice! "...when Zedekiah the king of Judah and all the men of war saw them, then they fled ... and he went out toward the Arabah. But the army of the Chaldeans pursued after them, and overtook Zedekiah in the plains of Jericho: and when they had taken him, they brought him up to Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon ... and he gave judgment upon him. Then the king of Babylon slew the sons of Zedekiah in Riblah before his eyes: also the king of Babylon slew all the nobles of Judah. Moreover he put out Zedekiah's eyes, and bound him in fetters, to carry him to Babylon. And the Chaldeans burned the king's house, and the houses of the people, with fire, and brake down the walls of Jerusalem" (Jer. 39:4-8).

The voice of the Lord was correct — it **always** is! Only fools reject God's Word and steadfastly march to their own destruction. May we learn, and heed the voice of the Lord!

When King Hezekiah came to the throne, he inherited a bad situation. His father, Ahaz, had reigned for 16 years. The Bible says that Ahaz "did not that which was right in the sight of the Lord his God..." (2 Kgs. 15:38).

Because of his wickedness, God allowed other nations to afflict Israel. All of the silver and gold from the temple was taken and given to the king of Assyria. So when Hezekiah rose to lead Israel, the nation was bankrupt financially and morally. In spite of the things his father had done, the Bible tells us that Hezekiah "did that which was right in the sight of the Lord" (2 Kgs. 18:3). As a result, "The Lord was with him; and he prospered whithersoever he went forth" (2 Kgs. 18:7).

Studies for the week of June 9, 2013

What Job Longed For, We Have Assurance Of (Job 9)

Job, though he trusted God, was confused about a number of things during his suffering; thankfully we have a more complete picture of God during the New Testament age.

Some of what he loved for, we have the assurance of...

1. A powerful, but also loving God

- a. Job spoke of the greatness of God and the humility of man; almost as if God was unapproachable (9:2-12); he fell short in failing to see or understand that God was for him.
- b. We know both the greatness of God, but also His love towards man in reaching out to save him (Ps. 8:4; Rom. 5:8; Jn 3:16; 1 Pet. 5:7; 1 Tim. 2:4; 2 Cor. 1:3-4; Heb. 13:5-6).

2. A Daysman, or mediator, with God

- a. Job lamented there was no umpire/arbitrator between him and God for he felt his case was unjust. (9:33)
- b. We know we have a mediator with God (1 Tim. 1:15; 2:5), one who lays His hand on both God and man to unite them (Heb. 2:17-18; 5:9; 10:12, 14; 1 John 2:1-2; Rom. 8:1).

3. A life that has meaning and hope in Christ

- a. A number of times Job speaks of wishing he had not been born and longs for death (see Job 3); even here he speaks of the brevity and toil of life (9:25-26; 10:1, 18-22; 14:1-2); it seems odd to him that God created him for such difficulty.
- b. Yet, we can have a greater sense of purpose in life (Ecc. 12:13-14; Acts 17:27; Matt. 5:16; Phil. 1:21; Gal. 2:20; Eph. 2:10) and joy in knowing more of the life to come that has been assured by God (2 Cor. 1:19-22, 4:17, 5:1; 1 Cor. 15:58, 16:13; John 14:1-3; Rev. 14:13; 21:4; James 5:11).

Love Yourself

It seems odd to speak of loving yourself when so often we think of the need for humility and the danger of pride; yet to be the person God desires us to be, there must be a healthy love for self.

1. Healthy love for self is not egomania.

- a. Such is pictured in 2 Tim. 3:1-5 where we would put ourselves and our best interest above all else.
- b. Such is contrary to many passages of scripture (Matt. 5:1-8; Luke 9:23; Phil. 2:3ff; etc.).

2. Healthy love for self is opposed self-hatred

- a. Self-hatred fails to appreciate that we are special in the sight of God (Prov. 11:17; Gen. 1:26-27; Ps. 8:4)
- b. Self-hatred seeks to destroy that which God sees as special.

3. Healthy love for self is right and even necessary

- a. Allows us to see ourselves as God does; His special creation whom He loves (Gen. 1:26-27; John 3:16; Rom. 5:8; 1 Pet. 1:18-19).
- b. Allows us to deal with others properly (Matt. 19:19; Eph. 5:28; Matt. 7:12).
- c. Allows us to view our responsibilities as stewards correctly (1 Cor. 4:1-2; Ps. 8:6; 1 Cor. 12:12ff; Matt. 25:14-30; 1 Tim. 1:12-16). Not worthless but entrusted servants of God!
- d. Allows us to appreciate who we are and what we have (James 2:5; Rom. 8:17; 2 Pet. 2:5, 9; Rev. 5:10; 7:9).
- **4. Healthy love for self seeks our souls best interest** by following God (James 1:21-22) thus bringing peace with God and man (Phil. 4:9; Matt. 22:27-40) and sets an example for others (Matt. 5:16; Phil. 2:15-16).
