How Important Is Our Gospel Meeting?

One of the most successful and proven ways of spreading the borders of the Lord's kingdom, both in the past and in the present, is through planting the seed of the kingdom in such efforts as Gospel Meetings (Lk. 8:11). There is no way to possibly know how many Gospel Meetings have been conducted since the first one on Pentecost! It is doubtful that any would even dare to guess how many souls, perhaps even yours, have been first enlightened with the Gospel in such efforts. It brings joy to our hearts just to ponder the thought that through many centuries legions of faithful soldiers of the cross have traveled far and wide to proclaim the powerful Gospel of Christ because of their concern and interest in the lost! It is also of great interest, and known only to God, to think how many souls have been garnered into "the harvest" for the last day (Jn. 4:35) by such efforts. Many who read these words were likely obedient to the conditions of pardon in the Gospel during one of these efforts.

Important To Please Our King

No individual Christian can possibly be pleased with himself or herself without seeking to please his King! He went to the cruel cross because of His desire "to seek and save the lost" (Lk. 19:10; Mt. 26:28). He sent the apostles out to offer the terms of obedience by which the lost might be redeemed (Mk. 16:15,16).

Likewise, He told them to teach us "to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you" (Mt. 28:20). Therefore, if they were under obligation to preach and teach all nations, so are we! Early Christians continued steadfastly in this work, and so must we (Acts 2:42). Our Gospel Meeting is important, then, to please our King. Can He depend on us to do our best? Will we invite, advertise, talk to others, and pray for the good results of this effort to preach the Gospel? Can we afford to do otherwise?

Important To The Lost

Our Gospel Meeting is important especially to those whose thoughts have not been brought into captivity to the obedience of Christ (2 Cor. 10:5). If any are not under Divine control through hearing and obeying the Word sent from Heaven, they are out of control for salvation (Ps. 119:10,11). Wickedness is strongly fortified by human passion, ignorance, and prejudice. These strongholds of wickedness in those who walk in moral flesh as they head for destruction are difficult to break. But the Gospel is God's powerful means through which sinful souls may hear, learn, and be made free (Jn. 8:31,32). The Gospel is God's forceful mode of operation, in the hard hearts of men, which is able to break down every false reasoning: of philosophy, even the reasonings of rationalists, which the devil uses to keep men in the darkness of sin and ignorance (Rom. 1:16,17). Surely we can see that it is important to the lost to hear the Message! Without hearing, saving faith cannot be established in the lives of our family and friends (cf. Heb. 11:6)! We must remember that this saving faith comes only by hearing the Word of God (Rom. 10:17). How very important it is, then, that we conduct this Gospel Meeting.

Important to Living Christians

Edification is necessary in the command to us to keep our faith strong (Eph. 6:10). Without a regular diet of Truth, we will become weak and cannot overcome the sin of the world in order to enter Heaven at last (Heb. 4:1). Christians must "continue in the faith grounded and settled and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel" (Col. 1:23). We must see the importance of this Gospel Meeting for ourselves! Some are perhaps now on the verge of falling back into the world. Thus, life-restoring exhortation can be gained in this Gospel Meeting, which to us is



"Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they suffered in this way? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do yo think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish.

Stop Assuming God will Forgive Your Sin

I magine walking into an expensive restaurant and seeing an old friend, already enjoying his dinner. When you see the half-eaten feast on your friend's table, you think to yourself, "Wow! He's really pigging out tonight. That's going to be huge bill." You wave to your friend and he waves back. When you finish your dinner the waiter brings your check. To your surprise, the waiter has added someone else's meal to your ticket. "What's the meaning of this," you ask the waiter. The waiter replies, "Your friend said you wouldn't mind picking up the tab, so we put his meal on your bill."

Personally, I would be outraged with such a person and I would no longer consider that man a "friend." But are we doing the same thing to God?

Are we being presumptuous about God's grace? Do we say things like, "Well, if it is wrong, God's grace will cover it"? In other words, "I'm going to pig out and expect God to take care of the consequences. I believe that is the grossest form of arrogance alive in the religious world today!

A Watered-Down Gospel

The gospel has become so watered-down and perverted that we have a generation of people who have a completely warped understanding of Christ, Christianity, and the grace of God. The true gospel of Jesus Christ brings about **repentance** in those who understand it and respond to it (Titus 2:11-12), but many have abandoned Jesus' message of, "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matthew 4:17). Instead, we teach that Jesus just wants you to enjoy yourself, and He'll pick up the tab.

How can you read the words of Christ and think Jesus takes sin so lightly? How can you think He is alright with you continuing to live like the world? Jesus taught <u>radical repentance</u>! He said, "And if your hand or your foot causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life crippled or lame than with two hands or two feet to be thrown into the eternal fire. And if your eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into the hell of fire" (Matthew 18:8-9).

The horror of the cross should teach us about the love of Christ, but also about the destructive and damnable nature of sin. If you think wearing a cross around your neck or calling yourself a "Christian" gives you a license to continue in a sensual and profligate lifestyle, you don't understand the Good News!

A Hodgepodge Religion

This live-however-I-want-and-assume-God-will-forgive-me religion is anything but Christianity. Christianity embraces God's love, forgiveness, and mercy but does not take it for granted! Sure, you can find many verses about God's mercy and forgiveness in Scripture, but how do you ignore all the verses concerning repentance and righteous living?

Please understand the truth, you cannot save yourself by living a sin-free life, but you also cannot be saved by Christ while continuing to presumptuously live in sin!

An Appeal

None of us are perfect. We all have sin and struggles. John wrote, "If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us" (1 John 1:10). But he also went on to write, "Everyone who makes a practice of sinning also practices law-lessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he appeared in order to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him keeps on sinning; no one who keeps on sinning has either seen him or known him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Whoever practices righteousness is righteous, as he is righteous. Whoever makes a practice of sinning is of the devil, for the devil has been sinning from the beginning..." (1 John 3:4-8a).

If we understand the gospel, we will do our best NOT to sin (1 John 2:1). If we understand the gospel, we will not become sinfully presumptuous about God's grace!

- Please do not, "pervert the grace of our God into a license for immorality and deny Jesus Christ our only Sovereign and Lord" (Jude 4).
- Please do not, "presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance" (Romans 2:4).
- Please do not, "go on sinning deliberately after receiving the knowledge of the truth," because if you do, "there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a fearful expectation of judgment, and a fury of fire that will consume the adversaries" (Hebrews 10:26-27).

I hope this gives you something to think about. I hope you'll think twice before presumptuously charging a sin to Christ's account! You'll never be able to pay Him back – so please don't try – but stop assuming He doesn't mind you continuing to do that which sent Him to the cross!

Studies for the week of April 27, 2014

Studies in Luke—Call to Repentance—13:1-9

- ♦ There was a common belief in the first century that if something bad happened to you, it was because of sin in your life.
- ◆ This chapter begins with such a belief on the part of Jesus' audience.
- ◆ Jesus dispels the theory by stating, "No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish."
- ♦ Jesus uses the occasion to once again teach on the urgency concerning the time.
 - ♦ The generation Jesus was speaking to was headed for disaster!
 - ♦ However, they had an advantage. Jesus was giving them warning.
- ◆ The Parable of the Barren Fig Tree (6-9) represents Israel.
 - ♦ They had been groomed for generations to bear fruit, yet they bore none.
 - ◆ The patience of the owner (God) is wearing thin.
- ♦ Jesus again heals on the Sabbath (10-13), breaking Israel's traditions, but not God's law.
 - ♦ The ruler of the synagogue is indignant (14), but Jesus points out the inconsistency of their practices (15-17).
- ◆ Israel's rejection is again shown in Jesus answer (24-30) to the question, "Lord, will those who are saved by few?" (23)
 - ♦ Notice especially verses 29,30. Israel would be cast out & the Gentiles would sit down in the kingdom of God.
 - ♦ Why? Paul deals with this in detail in Romans 9-11.
- ◆ This chapter closes with Jesus' lament over sinful Jerusalem.
- ♦ In ch. 12, Jesus exhorted the people to wake up to what time it is.
- ◆ In application, this chapter holds the same message: **Repent!**

Wednesday PM Mark: Chapter 9 Epistle of James—The Sin of Respect of Persons (1) 2:1-7

Sunday Class Terms of Entrance into the New Testament Church

- ♦ This text gives further example of inconsistency on the part of those whose practice of pure and undefiled religion was defective.
- ♦ Must Not Be a Respecter of Persons (1)
 - ♦ "Show no partiality"
 - ◆ "Partiality" and "the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ" have nothing to do with one another—to try to hold both is inconsistent
 - ♦ It is impossible for one properly to approach God in worship if the heart is not right.

♦ Practice By Some (2-4)

- A distinction was being made between the rich and the poor the rich being honored and the poor dishonored.
- ◆ This actually showed a doubt in their faith (which taught equality in Christ)
- ◆ Thus, they set themselves as judge—a position belonging only to God.
- ♦ Are we guilty of the same?

♦ Riches of Poverty and Poverty of Riches (5-7)

- ◆ James reminds his readers that most Christians are poor, and should relate much more with the poor man.
- ♦ As a general rule, the poor are much more receptive to the gospel than the rich.
- ◆ James reminds them of the sins of the rich—they oppress, they drag you into court, they dishonor the name of Jesus.
- ♦ The application is obviously much broader than just rich and poor. We make distinctions between people for many reasons, and all are sinful.
