Forty Things We All Need to Know **About the Church**

- 1. It is God's "ekklesia" (the called out), those sanctified (set apart). (2 Thessalonians 2:14; 1 Corinthians 1:2; 1 Peter 2:10)
- 2. It is the aggregate of those cleansed/redeemed/saved from their sins by the blood of Christ. (Ephesians 1:7; 1 Peter 1:18-19; Revelation 1:5)
- 3. It was in the eternal purpose of God. (Ephesians 3:10-11; 2 Timothy 1:8-11; Titus 1:2-3)
- 4. It was the subject of prophecy: mountain of the Lord's house; kingdom never to be destroyed. (Isaiah 2:2-3; Daniel 2:44; 7:13-14)
- 5. It was prepared for by John the Baptist and Jesus. (Matthew 3:1-2; 4:17; Mark 1:14-15)
- 6. It was pictured/described by many parables. (Matthew 13:1-52; John 15:1-8; et
- 7. It is not of this world (not a political entity). (John 18:36)
- 8. It was established by Christ. (Matthew 16:18).
- 9. The deity of Christ is its foundation. (Matthew 16:18; cf. 1 Corinthians 3:11; 1 Peter 2:6)
- 10. It cannot be shaken. (Hebrews 12:28)
- 11. It was established in Jerusalem on the first Pentecost following Christ's resurrection. (Mark 9:1; Acts 1:8; 2:1-4)
- 12. All the saved are added to it. (Acts 2:41, 47)
- 13. It was purchased with the blood of Christ. (Acts 20:28)
- 14. It is Christ's spiritual body. (Colossians 1:18, 24)
- 15. Christ is its head. (Ephesians 1:22-23; Colossians 1:18)
- 16. There is only one body; therefore, there is only one true church. (Ephesians 4:4).
- 17. It is pre-denominational, undenominational, anti-denominational; division among followers of Christ is sinful. (John 17:20-21; 1 Corinthians 1:10-13; Romans 16:17)
- 18. Not all churches are the true church; departures from the "one faith" have occurred. (Matthew 7:15; 15:8-9; Acts 20:29-30; 1 Timothy 4:1-3; 2 John 9).

- 19. Christ is the Savior of the church. (Ephesians 5:23)
- 20. It is the bride of Christ. (Romans 7:2-4; Ephesians 5:25-33)
- 21. It is where reconciliation to God takes place. (Ephesians 2:13-16)
- 22. It is the temple of God. (Ephesians 2:19-22).
- 23. It is the manifestation and fruition of the manifold (multi-faceted) wisdom of God. (Ephesians 3:10)
- 24. It is the place where God is glorified. (Ephesians 3:20-21)
- 25. It is the house/household/family of God. (1 Timothy 3:15; Hebrews 3:5-6)
- 26. It is the pillar and ground of the truth. (1 Timothy 3:15; cf. John 17:17)
- 27. It is a spiritual house made up of living stones. (1) Peter 2:5)
- 28. It is a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, God's own special people. (1 Peter 2:9; Titus 2:14)
- 29. It comes into existence where the gospel is preached, believed, and obeyed. (Luke 8:11; 1 Peter 1:22-25; Romans 1:16; 6:16-18)
- 30. We are to preach it. (Acts 8:12)
- 31. One must be born again to enter it. (John 3:3-5)
- 32. One must enter it as a little child. (Matthew 18:3; 19:14)
- 33. It is manifested in autonomous congregations/local churches. (Acts 8:1; 13:1; 1 Corinthians 1:2; Acts 14:23; Philippians 1:1; 1 Peter 5:1-4)
- 34. It is appropriate to talk about "going to church" (i.e., the assembly). (1 Corinthians 11:18, 20, 33; 14:19, 23, 34-35)
- 35. It has no exclusive, patented name; various descriptors. (Romans 16:16; 2 Thessalonians 1:4; Hebrews

12:22-24)

- 36. It is guided solely by the word of God. (Acts 2:42; Colossians 3:17; 2 Timothy 3:16-17)
- 37. It worships according to God's divine standard. (John 4:24; 17:17)
- 38. It has a three-fold mission: evangelism, edification, benevolence. (Matthew 28:18-20; Ephesians 4:11-16; Galatians. 6:10; James 1:27)
- 39. It must have top priority in our lives. (Matthew 6:33)
- 40. It will ultimately be delivered to God the Father. (1 Corinthians 15:24)

Evaluating A Hymn

The first surprise might be that we should evaluate a hymn at all. Yet why should we not? If our hymns are to be sung not only with spirit but with our minds (1 Corinthians 14:15), then we should think about the songs we sing. If our hymns are to allow "the word of Christ [to] dwell in [us] richly as [we] teach and admonish" each other (Colossians 3:16), then we should think about what our hymns teach.

So how ought we to evaluate a song? What questions might we ask of it?

- What category is this song? Can you categorize the song? Is it a prayer set to music, an anthem of praise, one where we "speak to one another," or encourage one another.
- Are the words God-centered? We could ask whether the words are God-centered, mention Christ or the Holy Spirit. It would be hard to call it a spiritual song if it does not mention one of these three.

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- Is it drawn from Scripture? As you read the words of the song, are you reminded of a passage or passages of Scripture by these words? Identify the passage, and if the hymnbook is yours, write it in the margin of the song. If it does not remind you of a Bible passage, that might be a sign it is not spiritual writing.
- Does the music serve the words? Does the music serve the words well? How does the music help the words? Some songs are contemplative, such as Isaac Watts' When I Survey the Wondrous Cross. Others are victorious, such as Fanny Crosby's Praise Him! Praise Him! Some songs have both elements, such as Robert Lowey's Low in the Grave He Lay. In this song, the verses' solemn words (Low in the grave he lay, Jesus my savior") are followed by a triumphant chorus ("Up from the grave he arose, with a mighty triumph o'er his foes"). As you recall, the solemn music of the verse fits those words, while the music of the chorus soars higher and higher as the thoughts rise.
- What is the song's key phrase? Is there a phrase that really stands out in this song? Sometimes there is a line that makes a particular song sublime. I think of the Norwegian hymn *Then Sings My Soul* when the author notes: "And when I think/ That God his son not sparing/ Sent him to die/ I scarce can take it in" or Brumley's classic line: "And I can't feel at home in this world anymore."

If we simply asked these questions, we will have done something people rarely do; we will have thought about the songs we sing. Don't you think the spiritual well-being of our congregation deserves at least that much effort?

Studies for the week of July 2, 2017

Lessons Learned from Hypocrites - Matthew 23

I. From Their Abuse of Authority.

A. Binding on Others What They Are Unwilling to Do.

- 1. They bound things on others they themselves were unwilling to do (1-4).
- 2. If we desire respect for God's word, we must practice what we preach!

B. Doing Works to Be Seen of Men.

- 1. When they did their works, they did them to be seen by others (5).
- We must do things to glorify God not ourselves (Matt. 5:16; 6:1-18).

C. Seeking Attention and Special Treatment.

- The Pharisees loved special treatment received from others (6-7).
- Jesus expected better of His disciples prohibited religious titles (8-12).

II. From Their Failure in Teaching.

A. Failing to Save Others.

- They failed to show others the way to the kingdom (13).
- Our teaching should save both ourselves and others (1 Tim. 4:16).

Misusing Religion for Money and Prestige.

- They used religion to take advantage of widows, and impress others (14).
- It is imperative that we do things honorable in the sight of all (2 Cor. 8:21).

C. Making People Worse Than Ourselves.

- The Pharisees did not make people better, they made them worse (15).
- We must teach "the whole counsel of God"!

D. Making Distinctions Where God Has Not.

- They made fine distinctions between the oaths one could swear (16-22).
- "Speak where the Bible speaks, and be silent where the Bible is silent".

III. From Their Inconsistency of Practice.

A. Leaving Commands of God Undone.

- They left undone the "weightier" matters of God's law (23-24).
- Jesus said we should do both, leaving neither undone, (Matt. 5:19).

B. Focusing Only on the Outer Man.

- The "blind" scribes and Pharisees focused only on the outside (25-28).
- We must emphasize true repentance conversion of the inner man (me. 825).

C. Honoring the Past, But Unwilling to Live It.

- Like their fathers, they murdered those they claimed to honor (29-39).
- 2. Are we willing to live what Jesus, Paul, Peter, John, etc. preached?

Sunday Class Romans 6:20ff Wed. Class Prayer

Instructions Concerning Elders and Slaves - 1 Timothy 5:17-6:2

- Treatment of Full-time Elders (17-18).
- A. Elders who rule well should be "counted worthy of double honor".
- B. Christians should love and honor all elders, but Paul meant something more when he said, "especially those who labor in the word and doctrine".
 - 1. The word translated "labor" means to work until one is exhausted.
 - 2. As we studied in v. 3, the word translated "honor" means more than to show respect - it also means the giving of material support.
 - To support that point, Paul quoted from two passages of Scripture.

II. Dealing with Accusations Against Elders and Elder's Sin (19-20).

- A. God instructed Timothy not to receive an accusation against an elder unless there were two or three witnesses.
- B. On the other hand, "those who are sinning rebuke in the presence of all".

III. Warning Against Haste or Partiality in Matters Regarding Elders (21-22).

- A. Paul charged Timothy to do these things "without prejudice" or "partiality".
- B. "Do not lay hands on anyone hastily, nor share in other people's sins."
 - 1. There are two possible explanations of v. 22.
 - a. Do not be hasty or partial in the appointing of men to serve as elders.
 - b. Do not be hasty or partial in the accusation and trial of elders.

IV. Paul's Concern Over Timothy's Health (23).

- A. Paul told Timothy to discontinue his practice of drinking only water.
- B. Paul advised Timothy to use a little wine.

V. Sins and Good Works Eventually Evident (24-25).

- A. Paul continues his thought to not be hasty in appointing men as elders.
 - 1. Some men's sins will be evident, other's will take a while to come to light.
 - 2. Some's good deeds will be evident, other's will take longer to see.
- B. Haste may result in appointing the wrong man, & overlooking the right man.
- VI. Instructions Concerning Slaves (6:1-2).
 - A. Christian slaves were to "count their own masters worthy of all honor, so that the name of God and His doctrine may not be blasphemed".
 - B. "Those who have believing masters" should "not despise them because they are brethren, but rather serve them" as "believers and beloved".
 - C. Paul told Timothy to "teach and exhort these things".
 - D. Though not slaves, the principles here can be applied to our daily life.
