We are privileged to have with us this week, preaching the Glorious Gospel of Christ, brother **Dave Rogers**. Reared in San Marcos, Texas, Dave was baptized there in 1971 and began preaching in 1979. He was educated at Austin Community College, Southwest Texas State University and the Victoria College, and is a 1980 graduate of the Southwest School of Bible Studies in Austin. Dave and Luann (neé Stewart) have three children and three grandchildren, and have worked with churches in Texas, Oklahoma and Georgia, where they are now in their fifth year with the Fayetteville church. They have worked frequently in short-term foreign and domestic mission efforts. Luann is a well-known author and frequent ladies' day speaker, and Dave has been privileged to serve as a teacher for both the Mangum (Oklahoma) School of Bible Iical Studies and now, the Georgia School of Preaching and Biblical Studies.

Is Baptism "Because Of" or "For" the Forgiveness of Sins?

In Acts 2:38 Peter told a crowd of people, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." The question we will consider today is this: Was Peter telling the people to be baptized in order to be forgiven or was he telling them to be baptized because they were already forgiven?

The Preposition εἰς

The word translated "for" in Acts 2:38 is the Greek word ɛiç (pronounced "ice"). Two scholars, A.T. Robertson and J.R. Mantey, have argued that in this passage the word ɛiç means, "because." They argued that Peter was telling the crowd, "Repent and be baptized because of the forgiveness of your sins." In other words, be baptized in order to show that your sins have already been forgiven.

The problem with Robertson and Mantey's argument is that the word $\varepsilon_i \zeta$ simply does NOT mean, "because of." It doesn't mean that in this passage...or in any passage. It often has the following meanings:

- to
- into
- unto
- for
- towards
- among
- at

It is used over 1,700 times in the New Testament and it shows movement toward a goal. It indicates purpose. The popular site, GotQuestions.org falsely claims that Matthew 12:41 proves ɛiç can mean "because." Matthew 12:41 says: "The men of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for they repented <u>at</u> the preaching of Jonah, and behold, something greater than Jonah is here."

In this passage, εἰς is translated "at." But it doesn't mean "because" it means "at the point of" or "when." The people of Nineveh repented "when" Jonah preached to them. Jesus

is saying the current generation would be condemned by the people of Nineveh because (Greek - $\delta\tau\iota$) the people of Nineveh repented at the point of ($\epsilon i \varsigma$) Jonah's preaching.

The word ɛiç never ever means "because" in the New Testament. That's simply not how the word was used. Those who claim otherwise are twisting the word to fit their preconceived theological ideas.

For the Forgiveness of Sins

In fact, there is another time the exact phrase, "for the forgiveness of sins" appears in the New Testament. In Matthew 26:27-28, Jesus says: "And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying, 'Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many **for the forgiveness of sins**.""

Did you catch that? Jesus said His blood would be poured out "for the forgiveness of sins." Could He have meant that His blood was poured out "because" sins had already been forgiven? Could He have meant He was going to die as an outward sign that sins were forgiven without His blood? Surely that conclusion is preposterous!

If the Greek phrase in Matthew 26:28 means "in order for sins to be forgiven" then why doesn't the exact same phrase in Acts 2:38 mean the same thing? The truth is, it *does* mean the same thing.

How It is Translated

Though many preachers, pastors, teachers, and commentators continue to argue for "because of" in Acts 2:38, it seems that translators of the Bible are almost always scholarly enough to treat the text well. Consider all of these translations:

- ESV "for the forgiveness of your sins"
- NIV "for the forgiveness of your sins"

truth."

- KJV "for the remission of sins"
- NASB "for the forgiveness of your sins"

Even many of the paraphrase Bibles do not accept the "because of" argument:

The Sacrifice That Costs Nothing

And what, you might ask, is a sacrifice that costs nothing? Isn't that a contradiction in terms? Don't all sacrifices cost something?

David used a phrase something like the one in the title of this article. He wanted to offer a sacrifice just outside Jerusalem on the land of an Israelite named Araunah. To his credit, Araunah offered the king all the resources needed for a sacrifice. Here they are, he declared, the wood, the oxen, the fire. That's when David used the phrase, "a sacrifice that cost me nothing."

"But the king said to Araunah, 'No, but I will buy it from you for a price. I will not offer burnt offerings to the Lord my God that cost me nothing." (2 Samuel 24:24).

Now I may be wrong, but he seems to be implying that people in his day might have viewed their service to the Lord in that way: "How much can I get away with? In order to receive God's blessing and protection, how little must I do?" I am reminded of the student who asks, "How little do I have to do to get a 'B' in your class?"

This reveals a sort of Bargain-rail approach to serving God. The problem with the Dollar stores is that although the price might look good, the quality and the return you receive is lacking. We understand what a sacrifice is: A millionaire might donate some money to give scholarships for bright students, but a single mother will sacrifice her own life by working two jobs and raising her kids so that she can pay for their college.

You recall the story about a fundraiser where the chicken volunteered to donate some of her eggs, and the cow offered some milk, and the pig offered to give some bacon for a good cause. After several minutes of discussion, the pig was heard to say, "It's all very well for you to be generous but I am committed!"

Throughout scripture, this is a consistent theme. When we give to God, it must be a sacrifice. The root meaning of the word "sacrifice" has to do with surrendering something to God of great value, in an effort to demonstrate our seriousness in serving him.

The answer to our question, of course, is that there is no such thing as a sacrifice that costs nothing. If it is a sacrifice, then it was very, very costly. The real question, when it comes to our service for God is this: When we give to God, is it a donation, or a sacrifice? The way you answer that question will say everything you need to know about your relationship with God.
